The people of this country have learned a few things about New York banks and their methods that it will take them a long time to forget.

Says the Philadelphia Telegraph: "It is said that President Roosevelt deposits his salary in a bank as soon as he receives it. You can't blame Teddy when you look at some of the people that hang around the White House."

The Jamestown Exposition closed Saturday night. It was the biggest fizzle financially in the history of the world—\$2,500,000 in debt. They should have sent to Oregon and got Jeff. Myers and a few others to run their fair.

At a meeting of representatives from every part of the state held at Portland Monday, it was decided not to ask Governor Chamberlain to call an extra session of the legislature at this time, but resolutions were adopted asking the Governor to continue the legal holidays for a period not to exceed ten days after the New York and Chicago banks resume specie payments.

Senator Simon, arguing in defence of the officers of the Title Guarantee & Trust Company, against the charge that they had taken deposits knowing the bank to be insolvent, says they cannot be punished therefor, because the statute that would punish this act, passed by the Legislature a year ago, is not yet in force. But, Senator, we know a statute on this subject, in an old law book, that is in force. It reads, "Thou shalt not steal." —Oregonian.

Ex-Secretary of the Treasury Shaw, long a western man, but now a New Yorker, says: "The west has lost confidence in the east. It will cost us here millions of dollars before we regain the prestige and cordial relationship of the past. The bankers of western cities have no love now for the bankers of New York. They had placed their money on deposit here, but when they asked for it they were refused. They say New York sought only to protect itself and tied up everything, so that all the rest of the country was forced to adopt urgent measures to save itself." There is likely to be considerable truth in this. The rest of the country will at least keep a close watch of New York and be sufficiently suspicious to prevent being caught in a like trap again—though it may be many years before like conditions arise.—Journal.

The fruit growers of Lincoln county have woken up at last and organized an association known as the Fruitgrowers Union of Lincoln county. This is what has been needed for a long time as everyone knows and should do good work. The members will be compelled to keep their orchards trimmed and sprayed, as the association will have an inspector for the purpose of seeing that this is done and also to show how to do so properly, thereby

increasing the value of the apples as they will raise larger, redder, smoother and better flavored apples. Also by pooling their apples and having different dealers bid on them they will receive a better price for the products of their orchards.
