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Many of our citizens living in the north end of the county are in trouble caused by the forest reserves created by the President at the close of the last session of Congress. These people took up claims and were residing upon them, complying with the law to the letter, when their claims were embodied in the reserve. Now they are trying to make proof on their homesteads, but their proofs are rejected on the grounds that they are timber lands. These lands had timber before the reserve was created, the same as most all the land on the Siletz, and Congress in passing the law throwing the Siletz open to homestead entry, knew the conditions. We believe concerted action should be taken by our people to have Congress correct the evil and at least give the homesteaders, living on their lands before the reserve was created and who have since continuously resided upon, and cultivated the land and made homes thereon, a right to make proof and receive patents. The following petition is being circulated in this county protesting against the act of creating this reserve:

PETITION.

To the Honorable Senators and Representatives, Oregon Delegation in Congress, Washington, D. C. Gentlemen.—We the undersigned residents and taxpayers of Lincoln county Oregon, do most earnestly protest against the act of March 1st, 1907, of the President, throwing a part of township six south, of range ten west, township seven south, of range ten west, and the greater part of township eight south, of range ten west, in Lincoln county, Oregon, within the Tillamook Forest Reserve, and the placing of nearly all of the south part of Lincoln county, commencing on the north line of township twelve south, of range ten west, and taking to the Lane county line on the south, within the Umpqua Forest Reserve, for the following reasons:

That nearly all of the timber within both of these reserves has already been taken under the homestead or timber and stone acts, and title has passed from the government therefor, and within these forest reserves are a large number of actual settlers who have settled upon the land in absolute good faith, have resided there and have cultivated and improved the same and are permanent residents of said county.

That by reason of the creation of these forest reserves, the value of their land has been greatly lessened and a great injustice has been done to them in many ways, one of which is that they are not allowed to burn slashings and clear up their land without first obtaining permits from the forestry warden, and before this can be done, the rainy season sets in and it is impossible for them to burn brush and clear the land and make the necessary improvements.

That besides this, the greater part of the land within these forest reserves is agricultural and grazing land and is not valuable for timber at all, and no good reason can be advanced for placing any part of Lincoln county in a forest reserve.

That the Tillamook and Umpqua forest reserves embrace nearly one-third of the entire area of the county, and therefore greatly burden the taxpayers of the balance of the county by placing upon them excessive taxes to maintain their county government and make up for the vacant lands that are embraced within said reserves, which would be taken and pass to title but for these reserves, and that the same cannot now be filed upon under any of the laws other than the homestead law, and then only upon certain conditions imposed by the forestry department and which tends to greatly discourage intending settlers.

That owners of land within said reserves, desiring to sell the same, can not obtain or realize therefor as much as other lands would sell for of the same kind and quality that is without the reserves, for the reason that settlers and purchasers of said land will not

pay the same, as a great many conditions and hardships are placed upon them by the department which they do not have to meet in living upon land outside of the reserves.

That within said forest reserves are many homestead settlers who filed upon their lands prior to the creation of these reserves and who have, since their creation, attempted to make final proof thereon, and they have been held up and greatly harassed by adverse reports being sent in to the department by the forestry warden in charge of said reserve.

Wherefore, we, and each of us, do most earnestly ask that you use your influence with the proper authorities at Washington and endeavor to have the act of the President, so creating said reserves, cancelled and set aside, and the lands embraced therein restored to entry under the public land laws of the United States.
