Schooner For Fir & Spruce Co.

Foard & Stokes Company of this city have closed a contract for the building of a steam schooner for carrying lumber from their mill at Toledo. The schooner will be patterned after the Bandon, and is to have a capacity for 450,000 feet of lumber.—Astorian.

Chicago won on the first ballot in the Republican National Committee for the location of the Republican National Convention of 1908. The vote stood 31 for Chicago, 18 for Kansas City and 4 for Denver. The date on which the convention will meet in June 16.

While the East is suffering from blizzards, etc., Lincoln county people are enjoying pleasant sunshine, warm rains and occasionally a light frost. Last Saturday County Superintendent Bethers picked enough ripe raspberries for dinner. Not such a disagreeable country after all, is it?

Work on the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition grounds at Seattle is progressing rapidly. Most of the grading for roadways, avenues, plazas and circles has been finished, and the grounds are enclosed by a fence. The contract for the erection of the emergency hospital has been let and the structure will be completed within the next few weeks. Contracts have been granted for four large buildings which are to be finished within six months. They are the Fine Arts palace, Auditorium, Machinery Hall and Manufacturers building. The three first will be permanent structures, being built out of buff brick and terra cotta trimmings.

In a letter from Congressman Hawley to H. R. Sturdevant, Chairman of the Republican County Central Committee, it states that Mr. Hawley has introduced a bill in Congress asking for an appropriation of \$10,000 for the improvement of this river from Toledo to Newport. An appropriation for this purpose is badly needed. With the removal of those sandbars seagoing vessels will be enabled to come to this place to take on and discharge cargoes. There are over four billion feet of merchantable timber that will go to market through Toledo, much of it will be manufactured into lumber here, and the way must be provided for vessels to reach here to carry this product to the markets.
