Pure Food Law.

The pure food law, known as the Burns bill, passed by the last legislature, went into effect January 1. It resembles the federal law and Food Commissioner Bailey expects to cooperate with the federal officials in its enforcement, says the Oregon Daily Journal. The law provides that the commissioner shall have power to make certain rules and regulations governing the sale of foods.

The law protects dealers from prosecutions where they have been sold adulterated food by wholesalers. By aid of the federal authorities the guilty parties can be apprehended when they are located in cities outside of Oregon.

The new law provides that butter, groceries and all foods must have a label stating the actual ingredients and the percentage of each contained in the food.

State of Missouri, county of Pike; to whom it may concern: The undersigned with on Tuesday, September 29, A. D., 1846, sell at public out cry, for cash, on premises where Coon creek crosses the old Mission road, the following chattels, to-wit: 6 yoke of oxen with yokes and chains, 2 wagons with beds, three nigger wenchies, 4 buck niggers, three nigger boys, 2 prairie plows, 25 steel traps, one barrel of pickled cabbage, one hog-head tobacco, one lot of nigger hoes, one spinning wheel, one Loom, 13 fox bounds, a lot of coon mink and skunk skins and a lot of other articles. Am gwine to California.
