In the matter of special road tax in road district No. 10, wherein a levy of 5 mills was made by the legal voters of said district, it is ordered that County Clerk enter said levy upon the tax roll for the year 1908.

In the matter of approving the town plat of Sheffield's Block addition to city of Newport. Ordered that said town plat be and is hereby approved.

In the matter of appointing Road Supervisors for Lincoln county for the year 1908. The court being fully advised therein by petitions, recommendations from different road districts and otherwise. It is ordered by the court that the hereinafter named residents of the hereinafter named road districts in said county, be and they are hereby appointed Road Supervisors of the following named road districts to-wit:

District No. 1, J. N. Taylor; No. 3 Arch McGinley; No. 5, Samuel C. Denny; No. 7, Charles Hassman; No. 9 J. K. M. Butler; No. 11, A. L. Chitwood; No. 13, L. C. Nortons; No. 15, Matt Ojala; No. 17, F. B. Leslie; No. 19 J. L. Williamson; No. 2, C. R. Evans; No. 4, A. J. Oglesby; No. 6, J. D. Logan; No. 8, W. A. Dickenson; No. 10, J. C. Dixon; No. 12, L. A. January; No. 14, A. L. McDonald; No. 16, Joseph C. Bones; No. 18, James Robertson.

And it is further ordered that each of the above named and appointed Road Supervisors make, execute and deliver a good and sufficient Bond in form and manner as by law provided, subject to the approval of the County Judge, in the sum of \$500.00, before entering upon his duties as such Road Supervisor.

In the matter of the petition of M. L. Trapp et al, for the creation of a new road district, by dividing road district No. 10. It is ordered that all that part of road district No. 10 lying north of the following described boundary line, to-wit: Beginning at the se. corner of section 7 in tp. 11 s. r. 9 west and running thence west one mile to the sw. corner of said section 7; thence north one mile and a half on tp. line; then due west to the west boundary line of said road district No. 10, be and the same is hereby created into a separate and new road district to be numbered as, Road District No. 14.

In the matter of annexing a certain part of Tide Water precinct to Alsea precinct for voting purposes. The petition of Ed Fletcher and others asking for an order annexing the territory embraced in the following described territory to-wit: Beginning at intersection of north meander line of Alsea Bay with the Pacific Ocean and running thence east on said line to range line between range 10 and 11 west; thence north to the northwest corner of section 30 t. 13 s. r. 10 west; thence east to the nw. corner of the ne. 1/4 of the ne. 1/4 of section 27 t. 13 s. r. 10 west; thence south to the third standard parallel; thence to the se. corner of section 31 t. 13 s. r. 10 west, to the Alsea election precinct, and the court being fully advised in the premises, it is ordered that the above named territory embraced within the above described boundary lines be annexed to the Alsea election precinct and that the same shall become a part thereof: It is further ordered that the above described boundary lines shall become and be a part of the boundary line of said Alsea precinct and the boundary lines of said Alsea precinct heretofore existing in so far as they conflict with the above described boundary lines, are hereby abolished.

In the matter of appointing a Superintendent of Dykes for the Olalla Dyking district No. 1 Lincoln county Oregon. It duly appearing that a large per cent of the property owners in said dyking district have petitioned for the appointment of I. B. McJunkin as Superintendent of dykes in said district and it further appearing he is a property or land owner therein and is fully qualified for such position, it is ordered that said I. B. McJunkin be and he is hereby appointed Superintendent of dykes in said dyking district for the year 1908.

It is further ordered that said Superintendent of dykes in behalf of said district notify the bondsmen of J. W. Parrish, contractor for building a dam and dyke for said dyking district, to either proceed to build said dam and dyke according to the plans and specifications thereof and the contract of J. W. Parrish with said dyking district, entered into through the county court acting for said dyking district, all of which are now on file in the County Clerk's office of said county, or pay the sum of 2000.00 to the County Treasurer for the benefit of said dyking district per the terms of said bond; and in case said bondsmen shall so fail to fulfill the terms of their said undertaking, then the said Superintendent in behalf of said dyking district is hereby authorized to take any and

all necessary steps as may be necessary to force the fulfillment of said undertaking on the part of the sureties therein. And said Superintendent of dykes is hereby authorized to take any and all necessary legal steps as may be necessary to enforce the terms of said contract and said undertaking, on the part of said dyking district.

In the matter of striking from the delinquent assessment list for the year 1906, all property heretofore purchased by Lincoln county, Oregon, at delinquent tax sales, where the time for the redemption of same has expired. Ordered that Sheriff strike from the delinquent roll said property.

Petition of M. M. Davis for the redemption of certain tracts of land, granted.

In the matter of the petition of M. Roddy et al, to establish, locate and lay out a county road. Petition granted, and it is therefore ordered that the County Surveyor and George King and James S. Hoops be and they are hereby appointed a board of county road viewers to view and lay out said proposed road as in said petition described and said board is hereby ordered to proceed to view and lay out said proposed road as prayed for in said petition in form and manner as by law provided, and said board of road viewers are further directed to meet for said purpose on the 20th day of January 1908 at 7 o'clock thereof at the residence known as the William Willis house in Yaquina, or on their failure to meet on said day, then within five days thereafter for said purpose, and that the County Clerk so notify said board of county road viewers.
