**State Editorial Association.**

The Oregon Press Association completed a very profitable business session in Portland last Saturday. Editors from every section of Oregon were in attendance. The name of the Association was changed to State Editorial Association of Oregon. A committee was appointed to formulate a schedule for a uniform scale of prices for all kinds of job work and advertising to be adopted by all newspapers in the State. Associations are to be formed by newspaper men in every county.

The following officers were elected for the ensuing year: President, J. S. Denlinger, Daily Astorian, Astoria; Vice-President, George Putnam, Tribune, Medford; Corresponding secretary, A. D. Moe, Glacier, Hood River; Recording secretary, George A. Seiford, Republican, Union; Treasurer, Miss Francis Gotshal; Trustees, George B. Small, Democrat, Baker City, three years; C. E. Fisher, Guard, Eugene, two years; C. L. Ireland, Observer, Moro, one year.

There is not a man in the democratic party in this county who could make a harder fight, for the office, than can Mr. Morrison.
