In the matter of the petition of Owen B. Playter, petition relative to taxes. Continued.

Petition of F. B. Roberts, et al, to have Siletz river declared a public highway, dismissed.

Remonstrance of Fir & Spruce Lumber Company, remonstrance against Roberts, et al, dismissed.

Petition of F. H. Phillips, et al, asking for rebate and reduction of taxes, dismissed.

Petition of Mrs. F. A. Parry, for rebate of taxes, \$918, continued.

Petition of John Q. Adams for rebate of taxes in sum of \$23.00, continued.

Petition of W. A. Dickenson, et al, to survey and locate a county road, granted.

Remonstrance of A. T. Peterson, et al for the purpose of laying out a county road, dismissed.

In the matter of the letter from N. J. Goodman, explaining return of money donated by the Court to Mr. and Mrs. Chance, considered, and it is ordered that County Clerk cash the check now in his custody in favor of J. N. Goodman, in the sum of \$20 and return said sum to the General Fund of Lincoln county.

In the matter of establishing a County High School. The petition of I. B. McJunkin, et al, asking for an order of the Court submitting to the qualified electors of Lincoln county at the next general state election the proposition of establishing and maintaining a County High School within and for said county, it is ordered that the said petition be granted.

In the matter of the petition of M. Roddy, et al, for the location of a County road. Ordered that the petition be granted and that said road be opened in manner as by law provided.

In the matter of the payment of jurors and witnesses for February term of Circuit Court, ordered Clerk draw warrant in favor of each juror and witness for the amount claimed in the Jury and Witness book.

Matter of appointing Road Supervisor for district Nos. 11 and 12. Continued.

Clerk ordered to break seals and prepare ballot boxes for the next primary election.

Petition of John Sijota, for cancellation of tax, granted.

Petition of Carrie M. Freeman for rebate of tax, dismissed.

Petition of I. B. McJunkin, asking Court for an order declaring contract with J. W. Parrish for building Olalla dyke and dam void, dismissed.

Petition of J. W. Parrish relative to completing contract on Olalla dam, dismissed.

In the matter of appointing of special county assessor. It duly appearing to the court that the present assessor J. H. Lutz, has failed to commence or continuously and vigorously prosecute the making of the assessment for the year 1908 in manner provided by law or otherwise. That said J. H. Lutz when last heard from was in the city of Portland, Oregon, and has been absent from Lincoln county, Oregon, practically or nearly all the time during the year last past and is now absent from said Lincoln county, Oregon, but now absolutely fails and has for many months last past utterly failed to attend to the duties pertaining to his office as assessor of said county, and the court being fully advised in the

premises, and by virtue of Section 38 at page 197, General Laws of the state of Oregon for the year 1907, it is ordered by the court that Walter E. Ball be and he is hereby appointed a special assessor for the county of Lincoln county of Oregon, to make the assessment for the year 1908 and to do and perform all the duties pertaining to the office of county assessor and to have access to the assessor's office in the county court house and full charge and control of all records, books, plats, maps and other property belonging to said office of assessor: And it is further ordered that he, as such special assessor, shall have all the duties, rights, privileges and emoluments of the assessor in making the assessment for the current year, and whose acts shall have the same effect as if the same had been done by the assessor, upon his giving the proper official undertaking in the sum of \$5000 and taking the oath of office in manner and form as by law provided.

In the matter of approving the official bond of W. E. Ball as special assessor for Lincoln county, Oregon, for the year 1908 and it duly appearing that said bond is given in the sum of \$5000, the sum ordered given by this court and that it is duly and properly executed and signed and justified by good and sufficient sureties. It is hereby ordered that said bond be and the same is hereby approved.

In the matter of the Olalla Dyking District No. 1, at this time came on for consideration the matter of paying to the creditors of J. W. Parrish (by reason of material furnished and services performed upon the Olalla dike and dam across Olalla Slough in Olalla dyking District No. 1, out of the special dyking fund of said Olalla Dyking Dist. No. 1 now in the custody of the county Treasurer of Lincoln county, Oregon) the sum of \$800 which said sum shall be placed in the care of the present superintendent of dykes of said dyking district, who is to pay out said sum of \$800 to said creditors only upon orders from said J. W. Parrish; and if further appearing said superintendent of dykes has agreed to this scheme and it appearing just and reasonable to the court by reason of the additional undertaking herein this day duly executed by said J. W. Parrish relative to completing said dam and dyke. Therefore it is hereby ordered that the county clerk of Lincoln county, Oregon, issue a county warrant or warrants to said I. B. McJunkin as such superintendent, on the special dyking fund of the said dyking district No. 1, aforesaid, in the sum of \$800 only. And it is further ordered that said I. B. McJunkin as such Superintendent pay out said sum of \$800 only upon orders duly signed by said J. W. Parrish to his, said J. W. Parrish's creditors by reason of their furnishing material or labor on the said dyke and dam, as aforesaid.

In the matter of the petition of W. A. Dickenson, et al, for the purpose of laying out a county road. It is ordered that Henry Howell and Frank Parker be appointed a board of county road viewers to view and locate said road in manner and form as by law required, and that they meet at the east approach to the fill or bridge on the Toledo Newport county road east of J. E. Stewart's dwelling house on Tuesday, March 10, 1908 at 10 o'clock a. m. thereof for the purpose of so viewing and locating said proposed county road, and after so viewed and located said road they report to this court in form and manner as by law provided.

In the matter of vacating the Miller addition to the City of Yaquina. At this time came on for consideration the petition of Lulu Miller relative to vacating Miller's addition to Yaquina, and it appearing to the Court that the petitioner has complied with all the requirements of the law, it is ordered that the petition be granted.
