Don't Forget.

The United States Postal Department has made new regulations in regard to carrying second-class mail matter (such as newspapers, magazines, periodicals, etc.) the same going into effect January 1, 1908, and allowing the publishers to April 1, 1908, to prepare their subscription lists in accordance with the new order of things. The effect of the change practically compels the establishment of new relations between the publisher and subscriber of county papers.

The department ruling requires that subscriptions to weekly newspapers entitled to the second class postage rate shall not be delinquent longer than one year.

The mails are not forbidden to subscribers who are in arrears longer than the time provided in the new ruling, but these subscribers are placed in a separate classification, requiring a higher rate of postage, the rate being so high that publishers could not afford to send papers at the price of subscription.

The reason given by the government for making this order is that second class mail matter is being carried through the mails at a rate for postage thereon which is less than the cost of carriage.

The Newport News, whose editor is the "Hello Girl" for one of the local telephone companies, takes exception last week to our article relative to the telephone situation in Lincoln county. We have no desire to bring forth a sermon from the News, or elsewhere. We simply wished to call attention to a condition of public service that was not as it should be. If the news, or its editorial writer thinks that their patrons are satisfied, let him ask any of them at Toledo or Newport, and we fancy he will become disabused. We are informed, however, by Mr. Peterson, the Manager of the Mutual Company that it had a proposition from the Lincoln County Company to either buy, sell or consolidate the two systems. We trust for the benefit of the public service that this will be done, with all due respect to the News.

We reprint an article from the Rulium published at Wedderburn, Curry county, under the head of "Cruise the Timber." As practically the same conditions exist in Lincoln county we believe it will make good reading. Our timber lands, the same as in Curry county, is assessed by the acre. The only thing to do is to cruise the timber and place the value at so much per thousand. But the problem of cruising this timber is a hard one for our County Court to solve. They are wrestling with the proposition now and undoubtedly some satisfactory arrangements will soon be made to have this work done.

John Kenfta who announces himself as a candidate for the nomination of County Commissioner, is a merchant of Siletz. He has been a resident in this county since 1902. He is a good business man, has made a success of his own business and would undoubtedly handle the affairs of the county in the same businesslike manner.

Dr. Carter announces himself as a candidate for the office of Coroner to succeed himself. The Doctor is too well known to the voters of Lincoln county to need an introduction. They know when they elect him

that he will do the right thing by the office.

GRAZING PERMITS FOR 1908.

Applications for permits to graze live stock on the Umpqua National Forest for the season of 1908 must be filed in the office of the undersigned at Eugene, Oregon, on or before March 15th, 1908.

The Secretary of Agriculture has authorized the grazing of 600 head of cattle and horses and 5000 head of sheep and goats, during the season of 1908.

The period during which grazing will be allowed and the fees to be charged are as follows: Grazing period, May 1 to October 31, 1908. Cattle 25 cts per head, Horses 25 cts per head, Yearling, ending April 30, 1909, Cattle 40 cts per head, Horses 30 per head.

May 1 to Oct 31, 1908. Sheep 9 cts per head, Goats 10 cts per head; Yearling May 1, 1908 to April 30, 1909, Sheep 14 cts per head Goats 16 cts per head.
