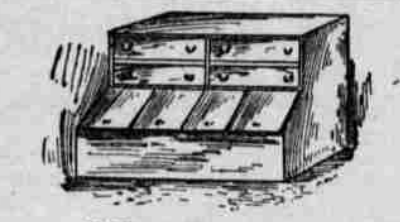

Handy Pantry Cabinet.
The illustration shows a homemade cabinet that will be found exceedingly convenient in the pantry. The drawers above are for bread, cake, pies, etc., while the receptacles below that have covers hinged so that they can be raised, are for sugar, flour, oatmeal, etc. All are right at hand, so that steps are saved to the house-

Keeper. Let the work be well done, and flies, ants and other pests will not find access to the contents of cabinet.

Savory Roast.
One pound of beefsteak (flank steak may be used), two teaspoonfuls of flour, one scant teaspoonful of salt, one saltspoonful of white pepper, one-half pint of cold water and one-quarter pound of beef kidney. Mix the flour, pepper and salt together on a plate; cut up the meat into thin slices, also the kidney into pieces; dip them in the flour and roll up; place them in a baking dish, add the water, cover with pastry and bake in a good oven. Mushrooms, olives or oysters may be added for a specially fine pie, and with this combination a good puff paste should be used as cover.

Oil Pickles.
Slice 100 small or medium-sized cucumbers without peeling. Lay in salt three hours under weight (salt to taste), drain, add three pints of small white onions, sliced, a piece of alum the size of a nutmeg, dissolved in hot water, three ounces of white mustard seed, three ounces of white ground pepper, one ounce of celery seed and one pint of olive oil. Mix all thoroughly and cover with cold cider vinegar.

Hominy Drop Cake.
Heat in a farina kettle one pint of boiled hominy broken into grains as lightly as possible with a fork; heat two eggs separately and stir the yolks into the hominy with one tablespoonful of water and one-half teaspoonful of salt; then add the whites. Drop in tablespoonfuls on buttered tins and bake to a golden brown in a quick oven.

Rice Blanc Mange.
Boil three-quarters of a cup of rice in milk in a double boiler. When cooked, add a half a box of gelatin dissolved in a little cold milk, add sugar and vanilla to taste. When cold, beat in a quart of cream that has been whipped to a stiff froth. Set in a wet mold in the ice box to form. Serve with raspberry juice poured over it.

Cream Scones.
Two cups of flour, three teaspoonfuls of baking powder, one-half teaspoon of salt, one-quarter cup of butter, two eggs, one-half cup of cream. Mix as baking powder biscuit, adding the beaten eggs with the cream. A diamond shape is attractive for scones. Bake on greased tin in a quick oven. Serve with chocolate for luncheon.

Celery Sauce.
Cut the stalks of a bunch of celery very fine, cover with hot water and let stew an hour. Mix three tablespoonfuls of melted butter with two tablespoonfuls of flour; add to the celery a pint of thin cream, stir in the butter and flour, season with salt and white pepper. Serve with duck, roast or boiled fowl.

Steamed Squash.
Cut the squash into pieces and scrape out the seeds and stringy part. Place in a steamer over boiling water, cover closely and cook until tender. When done, remove from shell and wash. To each pint allow two tablespoons butter, one level teaspoon sugar and salt and pepper to taste.

Roxbury Tart.
Quarter and stew twelve tart apples. Rub through a sieve and to each cupful of the pulp add a cupful of sugar, one-half cupful of melted butter, juice and grated rind of a lemon, one cupful of milk and three eggs, and half of a nutmeg. Beat all together. Bake in one crust as custard pie.

Layer Cake.
Cream a lump of butter the size of an egg with one cup of sugar. Beat three eggs light and add them to the sugar and butter mixture, and work in a cup of flour sifted with a teaspoonful of baking powder. Bake in two layer tins.
