Last Sunday the town of Vici, Oklahoma, was completely destroyed by a tornado. The storm which was about a mile wide and extended for fifty miles destroyed lives and property all along its course. 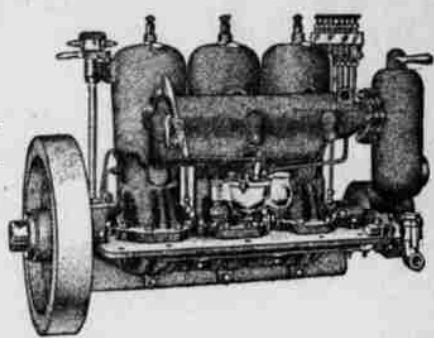
"And the republican who will be fooled by this transparent clap-trap should be taken out and treated for the simples."
