

"Jayhawkers of '49"

The DEATH VALLEY MAGAZINE, which is publishing the life of Death Valley Scotty, will begin the story of the "Jayhawkers of '49" in its May number. The "Jayhawkers" discovered and gave Death Valley its name. The story will be written by John B. Colton, one of the survivors who is now 75 years of age. He was the youngest member of the party, being 16 years old at the time.

April 5, 1849, the party, consisting of 36 members, organized at Galesburg, Ills., under the name of "Jayhawkers," and started to the gold fields of California. They were on foot the last 52 days of the trip, having abandoned their wagons and butchered their oxen for food.

There are four survivors, one a woman aged 94 years, who carried a child upon her back and keep in line while strong men fell dead or went insane upon the trail.

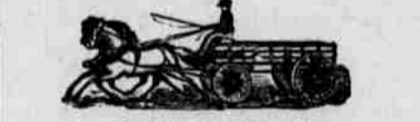
