Mr. H. H. Cook, candidate on the Socialist ticket for the office of County Commissioner, has been canvassing the Southern part of the county and returned home Saturday. Mr. Cook is counting on a good vote on June first.

Mr. Edward P. Irwin of the Newport Mail spent Friday and Saturday at Waldport. His subscription list was somewhat inflated when he returned home.

The Condor arrived in port Saturday bringing a large boiler for the sawmill. This has proved to be an awkward piece of machinery to handle and has been needed for some time. The entire crew of the Condor took the opportunity to attend the dance given by the band Saturday evening. Before leaving port the remainder of the fish net encountered on the Columbia River will be removed from the rudder and propeller.
