Where are the flies and yellow-jackets this summer?

This is the time of year when the Eastern farmer works fourteen hours a day, eats a little supper, sits around for an hour or two fanning himself then retires for a little rest and sleep. He throws a bed cover on the floor near the open door, spreads a thin sheet over himself and lays down to sweat and fight flies until about 2 o'clock in the morning when from sheer exhaustion he falls into a restless sleep for two hours, then gets up again tired and goes to work for another fourteen hours. That's living, too. The Oregon farmer does not waste any time wondering if the hot winds, chinch bugs, grasshoppers, drouths, cyclones or blizzards are coming to destroy his crops and year's work. He knows if he has in forty acres of crops that he will harvest a good crop off forty acres—no guessing about it. And all the time he is thinking how foolish he was that he did not come to Oregon long before he did.

Is No Deficit.

Opposition newspapers and orators have attempted to indict the Republican congress for extravagance and wastefulness because of an alleged deficit in the receipts of the government as compared with the expenditures.

The reports were misleading when not given careful attention, but the explanation by the secretary of the treasury shows that there is no deficit in the receipts and ordinary expenses of the government. It is in the extraordinary expenses that the deficit exists. Indeed, the receipts exceed the "ordinary" expenses of the government by over \$25,000,000.

In the extraordinary expenses—the Panama canal and like matters—the receipts were nearly \$45,000,000, and the expenditures nearly \$118,000,000, leaving a deficit of nearly \$76,000,000. These extraordinary expenditures are not supposed to be met from the general receipts of the government, but from bond issues for the purpose.

Of course there will be an increase of the public debt for Panama canals and works of that kind cost money.—Kelsonian.
