Section 1. Fourth Street shall be graded to conform to grade as now established and of record, and permanently improved with rock for space of sixteen feet wide in the center of the street, from east side of C. & E. rail road track to west side of Hill street, said rock bed

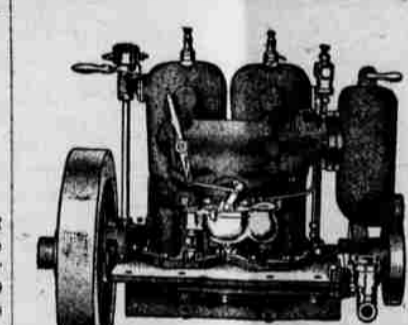
