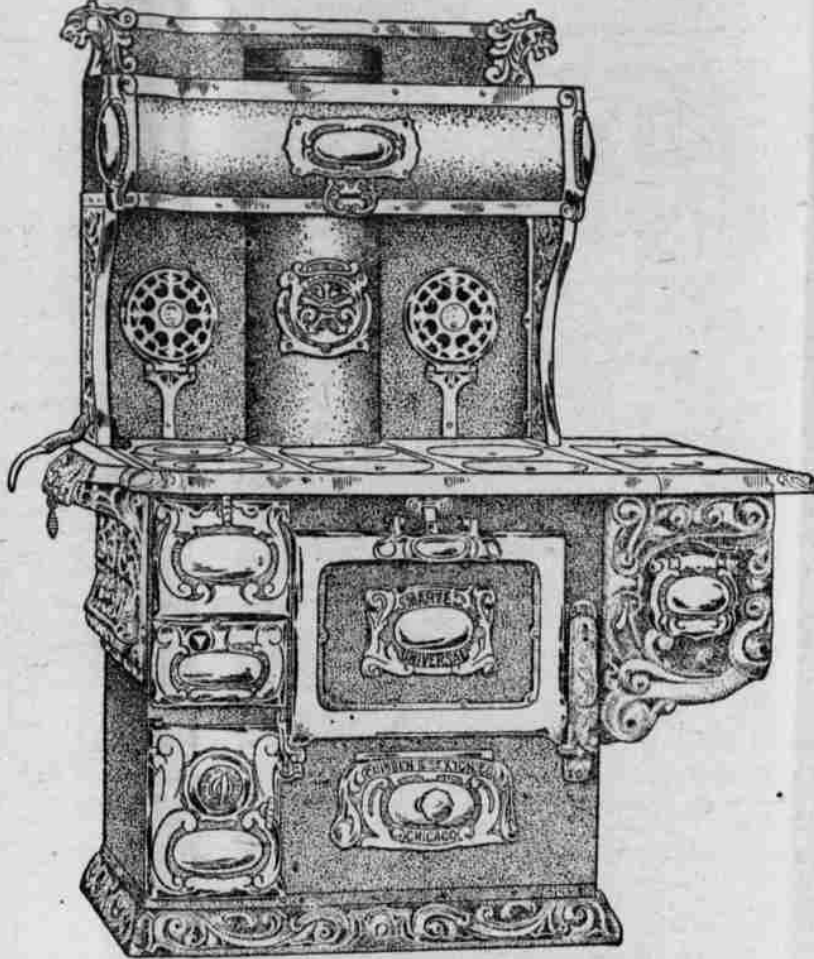
Bids Wanted
