Portland, August 24.

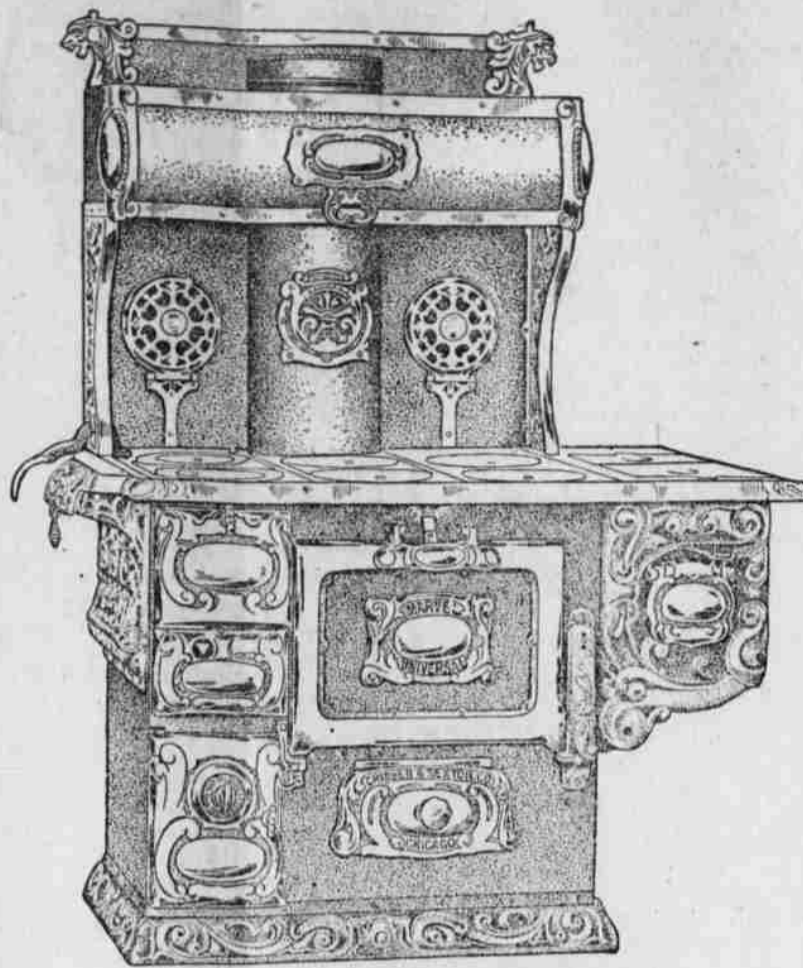
