A Truant Officer Appointed.

Among the other things that the district boundary board did at its session Wednesday was to appoint Sheriff J. H. Ross as truant officer for the entire county. So it will be well for all children between the ages of 9 and 14 to attend school, for if they don't they will surely hear from him. The law plainly states that all children between and including these ages must attend school. In the past the truant officers who were appointed refused to served, but Mr. Ross wishes to see the young ones obey the law as well as the older ones. So if there are any children in the county who have in the past been in school only a portion of the time, or in one day and out the next, they may decide to attend regularly from now on, as the law will be enforced.

morning and evening trains be retained failed to reach headquarters. New petitions were circulated, in duplicate, and sent in, but they also were pigeon-holed, evidently. We do not believe there is a person living in Toledo and vicinity that wants the noon trains retained. And we know the general feeling in Newport is the same. We cannot see one advantage to this country in having the noon train, but we can see many disadvantages. It will cause the people living down the river to lose two days in attending business at the county seat, and the people living up the river will have to stay from 10 or 11 o'clock one day till 4 or 5 in the afternoon of the next day in Toledo when transacting a little business here. It will require three or four days to go from this Bay to Portland, Salem or other Valley points further than Albany or Corvallis, and return. It will not help the people living at Waldport or Siletz to get to the Valley any quicker. In going to Portland they will take the train at noon, get to Corvallis and have to lay over until the next morning before continuing on their journey. It will take two full days for people from the Valley to come to the Bay and return. We don't want the noon train—but we've got it.

Waldport Items.

Postmaster B. W. Johnson, of Corvallis, passed through Waldport Monday on the way to Yachats.

Charles Eames, of Hillsboro, has purchased a lot near the school house and will erect a cottage.

The district school board has engaged Prof. Earl Brown, of Philomath, as principal of the Waldport school for the coming term. Miss Williams has been engaged as assistant.

Although nothing definite has been announced it now looks like the cannery at Waldport would remain idle this season. Manager Stillwell has been transferred to the Unquacannery. Practically all other canneries belonging to Elmore & Co. are in operation.

The road to Tidewater is now open for travel. Owing to the fact that the government failed to construct its part of the road near Canal creek, teams have to come down on the north side as far as the Bain place and ferry at that point.

Mr. Daly has a contract to deliver five hundred cords of shingle bolts at the Waldport mill. The bolts are to be hauled from the W. M. Brooks place down the beach. A four horse team and wide tire wagon have been purchased for this work.

The launch Rose, of Newport, came into Alsea bay about noon Tuesday morning bringing a number of passengers. The trip down was a pleasant one. The little craft was greatly admired by the Waldport people.
