Petition of Virgie Howell, et al, for repair of road. County Court agrees to appropriate \$150 to assist in improving said road, provided petitioners do \$150 worth of work on said road.

Report of Commissioner John Fogarty, on Waldport and Tidewater road, work done by Jas. Kent, approved

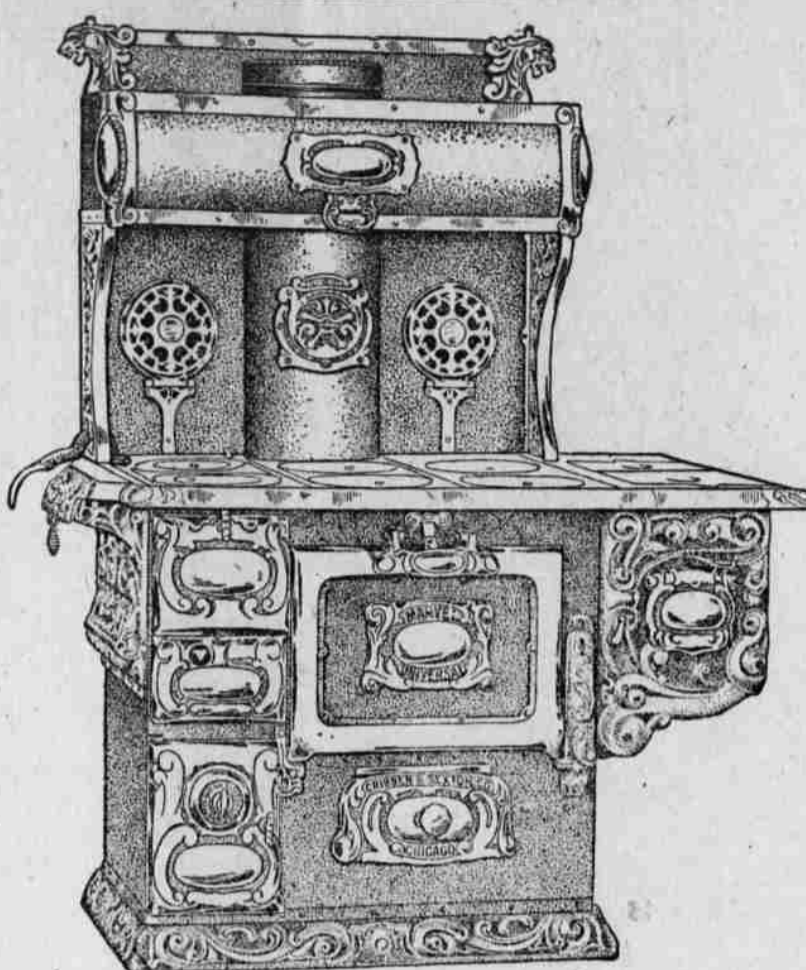
Petition of Chas. Stouder, et al relative to changing a county road, rejected.
