That Waldport-Tidewater Road

Waldport, Or., Oct. 3, 1908. LINCOLN COUNTY LEADER Toledo, Oregon.

Gentlemen:- In reply to Commissioners Fogarty's article in last week's issue permit me to submit the following contract and affidavits. It does not matter what conditions lead up to the contract. Suffice it to say that a contract was entered into in good faith by the County Court for the construction of a county road to be eight feet wide. Commissioner Fogarty was assigned the duty of reporting on the work and his report showed "work done" which could mean no other than an eight foot road bed.

It was Mr. Fogarty's duty to see that the contract was enforced to the letter. If not why have a contract? It matters not in cases of this kind whether the contractor makes ten dollars a day or loses it as far as the county is concerned. Contracts must be enforced else they are worse than useless and prevent others who would fill their contracts from bidding.

The Commissioner had no right to accept the statement of a bystander and one to whom the claim for work had been assigned. The additional work spoken of was not done until after September 9th when the work had been accepted. Mr. Banta's affidavit clearly shows this, for if the work had been done why did the contractor do any more. The added work did not materially change conditions.

The recall amendment passed by the people June 1st is an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Oregon. It provides for the duties of the County Clerk in case a recall petition is filed. It takes 262 voters to enforce the recall between this time and the next general election. I am only one of the 262.

The contract and report are matters of record and the "work done" can be inspected at any time by those wishing to do so.

AGREEMENT IN DUPLICATE

This agreement in duplicate, made and entered into this day of July, 1908, by and between Lincoln County, Oregon, the party of the first part and James Kent of Waldport, Oregon, the party of the second part, witnesseth: The party of the second part does hereby covenant, stipulate and agree to and with the party of the first part, to open, build and complete in a good workmanship manner that part of the Waldport-Tidewater county road beginning at the Forden ranch and running to Arnold creek by grading or building thereon a good solid eight foot road bed and where necessary ditch on either or both sides of said road way and place all necessary culverts thereon so as to draw the water therefrom, for the consideration therefor of \$200. The party of the second part fur-

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ther agrees, covenants and stipulates to and with said party of the first part to open, build and complete in a good workmanship manner that part of the Waldport-Tidewater county road beginning at the Bain place and running to Jack Earley's place by grading or building thereon a good solid eight foot road bed and where necessary, to ditch on either or both sides of said roadway and place all necessary culverts thereon so as to draw the water therefrom, for the further consideration of \$200. All of said work to be completed by October 1, 1908.

The party of the first part hereby agrees to and with said party of the second part to pay or cause to be paid to said second party the sum of \$200 in county warrants for said first work, and the further sum of \$200 in county warrants for said above-named second work the said second party to furnish all labor and material used thereon at his own proper cost and expense. Said second party is to have the free use of the county road plow and scraper in the road district in which said road is situated, for work in so completing said parts of said road. Said sum of \$400 is to be so paid when all of said work shall have been completed as above stated and accepted by the County Court of said county.
