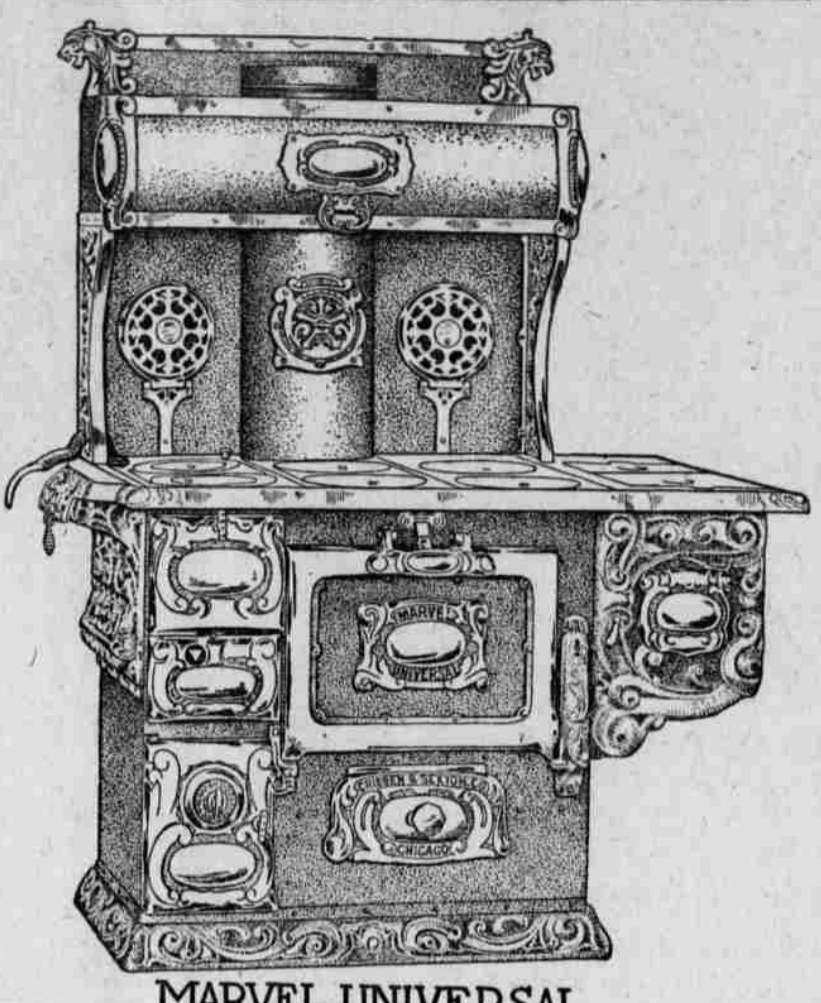
EXTRACT FROM LETTER OF A. J. OGLESBY, SUPERVISOR DIST. 4.
