My Dear Cook:—There is some likelihood of there being a recall petition out in a short time for Commissioner Fogarty. It seems that the Court contracted a road to be eight feet wide and it was only built a little over six in places and no where on the grades was it over seven and one-half feet wide. Mr. Fogarty came here and reported to the Court that it was built ACCORDING TO CONTRACT. This has roused the people and in case there is a recall petition it will be necessary to have a special election unless Mr. Fogarty resigns and the Court fills the place.

Now what I want is this. You lay low and say nothing about Fogarty in the matter although I know you will not stand for the raw deal on this road. Get all your socialist friends to sign the petition and stand by you in the election. Don't do it yourself but through your friends and with our help here I think we can put you in. I will not be in it this time and will do all in my power to assist you. You must run as an independent candidate favoring a square deal. This is no regular election and you can well afford to keep the flag furled this time. This is the first opportunity we have had to get down to a good roads basis and I know you will do all you can to assist us in getting in a man who knows a good road when he sees it.

Keep this strictly under your hat. Don't let it leak out in any way that you are to get assistance from this end of the county. Come out under your own colors and ask for all the assistance you can get. Your canvass over the county in May was a good one and while you did not poll a big vote as either of us thought you would we can see the reasons plainly when we come to consider what was done, in the various parts of the county and see how it was done. You and I did not put up any money but nevertheless there was plenty of it for Commissioner.

Well, Cook, let me know at once if you will come out on this kind of a proposition. The county must have a good man this time.

Then after paying the expenses of those who have been to any cost to get signatures and for postage and other expenses you will have all the funds you need
