CONTEST NOTICE.

A sufficient contest affidavit having been filed in this office by Anna D. Brown, contestee, in which it is alleged that she is well acquainted with the tract of land embraced in the homestead entry and knows the present condition of the same; also that said entryman has never established his residence on the said claim, nor has he resided thereon at any time, or at all, and has wholly abandoned the same for a period of more than six months last past; also that he has never cleared any portion of the land, or cultivated the soil, and the only improvements on the claim consist of a rudely constructed log cabin, wholly unfit for human habitation; and that said alleged absence from said land was not due to his employment in the Army, Navy or Marine Corps of the United States as a private soldier, officer, seaman or marine, during the war with Spain or during any other war in which the United States may be engaged. Said parties are hereby notified to appear, respond and offer evidence touching said allegation at 10 o'clock a. m. on November 14, 1908, before the Register and Receiver at the United States Land Office in Portland, Oregon.

The said contestant, having, in a proper affidavit, filed September 8, 1908, set forth facts which show that after due diligence personal service of this notice can not be made, it is hereby ordered and directed that such notice be given by due and proper publication.

Teachers' Permits.

Seven letters have been received recently by County Superintendent Goin requesting permits to teach. Mr. Goin, while always wishing to accommodate, will strictly follow the law in this as well as in all other matters. The following letters will be instructive to many:

Mrs. Waldport, Oregon,
Dear Madam:—In reply to your favor of April 8, will say that this is the first I have heard in regard to the matter of your permit. However, the matter of granting permits is one that is entirely in the hands of the county superintendent. You will notice that the county superintendent must grant a permit only upon a written examination, unless the applicant has a valid certificate or who is at the time entitled to a valid certificate. The word "valid" would mean that the certificate has not expired.

Mr. R. P. Goin, Waldport, Or.

Dear Sir:—I have before me your favor of the 13th inst., and in reply will say that the lady is entirely mistaken when she says that I said that the county superintendent could issue a permit with or without an examination, as he pleases, as the law states plainly that no permits shall be issued without an examination. I know that if I were in your place, I would not issue a permit to any person who did not pass as rapid an examination as is required for a county certificate. There is nothing to hinder the lady from taking an examination in the county in which she may reside at the time of the examination, receive a first grade certificate and have it endorsed in your county; or, there is nothing to hinder her taking the examination before any county superintendent and have her manuscripts examined by the county superintendent of Lincoln county and thereby have a regular certificate issued by the county superintendent of Lincoln county.

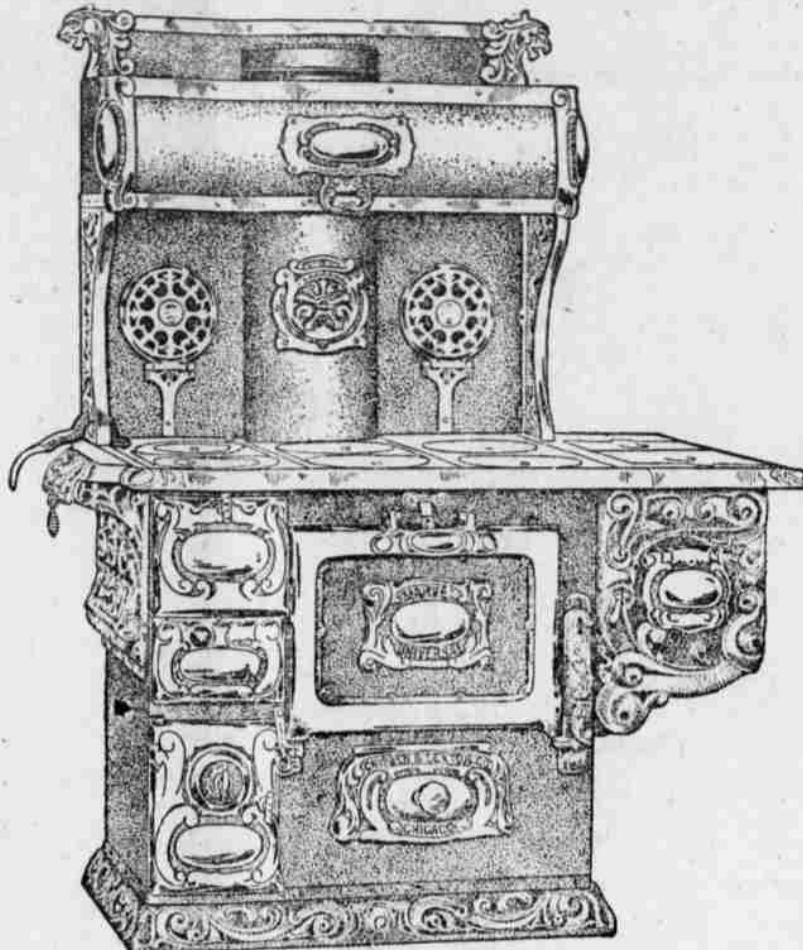

Section 37 of the School Laws says:

A temporary permit may be issued by the county superintendent in case of necessity, valid only in the county where issued, until the next regular public examination held by the county board of examiners for such county. Such permit may be granted without a written examination to the holder of a certificate, valid in any county in the state, who is entitled to the same, or to a holder of a certificate valid in any other state, when the applicant for the same shall present satisfactory testimonials of his good character and success as a teacher; but no permit shall be issued to any person not holding a valid certificate as herein set forth, except on a written examination equivalent to that required for a third grade certificate. A teacher shall not be entitled to receive more than two temporary permits in a county, nor shall an applicant who failed at the last regular public examination held of examiners for any county be entitled to receive a temporary permit for that or any other county in the state.
