County Commissioner Kentta was in Toledo several days last week working on the Toledo-Siletz wagon road proposition. Mr. Kentta is very anxious that this matter be taken up and the work commenced. His idea is to build the road leading north out of town through Run Bottom, cutting through the hill just west of John Crooks' place, and connecting with the Depoe slough road at the Enos place. The Newport road would connect with the Toledo-Siletz road at the top of the Dundon hill, where the new road would cross the Corvallis-Newport road. Mr. Kentta figures that with a cut of 25 or 30 feet through this hill, where it is very narrow, would make a very easy grade between town and the Enos place. Besides being an easy grade it would shorten the Newport road and make it a better grade. He believes this road can be built and planked cheaper than the planking can be laid on the old Newport road, and it would be cheaper for the county to maintain the one road than the two separate roads, as at present. He wants the people of Toledo to have the county surveyor survey this hill and ascertain the feasibility of establishing the road on these lines.

Construction is underway on 11 miles of paved paths and driveways at the grounds of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition at Seattle.
