County Treasurer McCluskey has issued a call for warrants up to and including January 9, 1908.

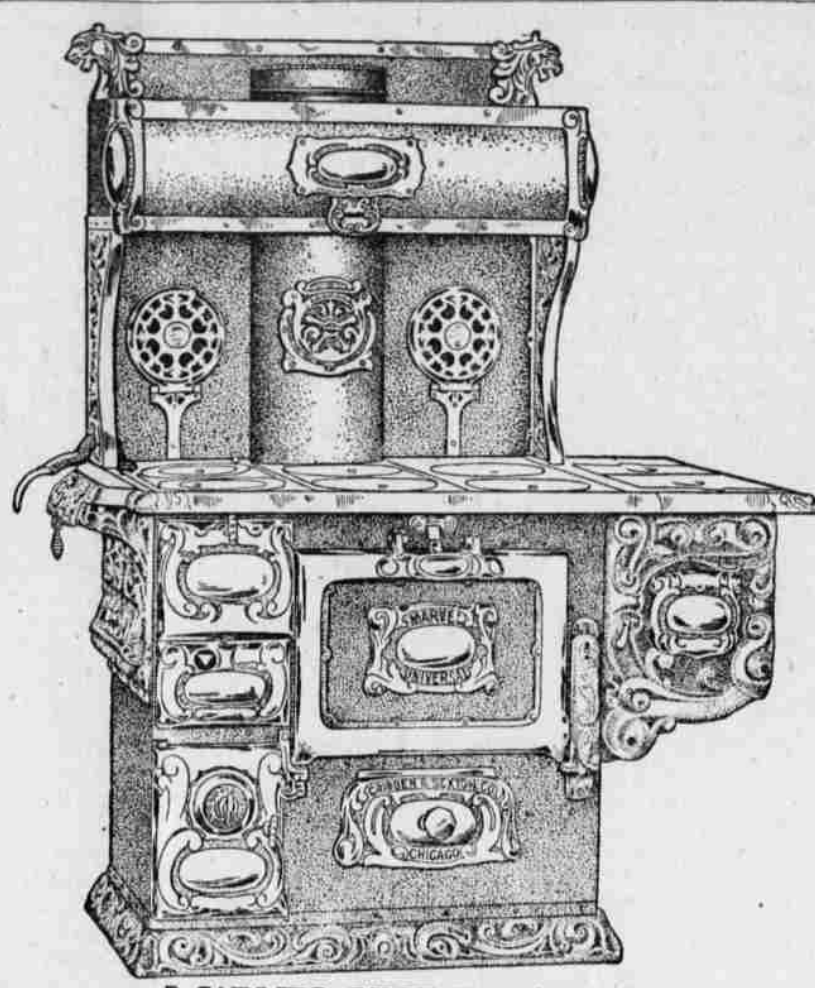
Miss Rena Bradson came up from Newport Monday for a visit at home. She returned to Newport last evening.
