FARMS AND FARMERS



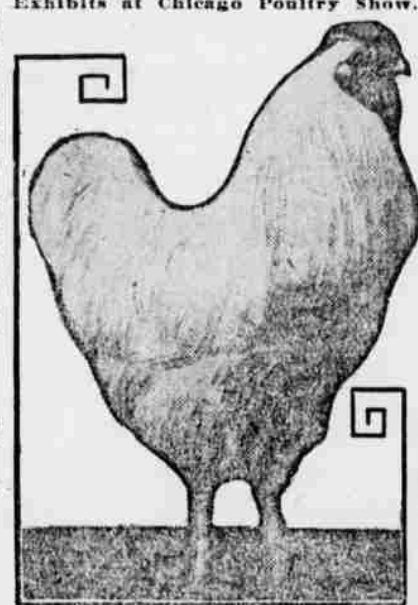
Veterinary Science.

A veterinary surgeon is a person skilled in the diseases of domestic animals. In the last decade there has been a keen awakening to the importance of veterinary science and agricultural colleges are adding a veterinary department to their curriculums. A consideration of the magnitude of the live stock industry of the United States emphasizes the necessity of veterinary knowledge to safeguard the interests of animal husbandry and protect the public health. The valuation of the horses in the country is recorded at \$1,867,530,000, mules at \$410,939,000, milch cows at \$850,057,000, other cattle at \$845,938,000, sheep at \$211,736,000 and swine at \$331,230,000. The grand total value of all the live stock in the country aggregates \$4,331,230,000 and represents such enormous wealth that the live stock industry can well afford to pay for the services of skilled veterinarians.

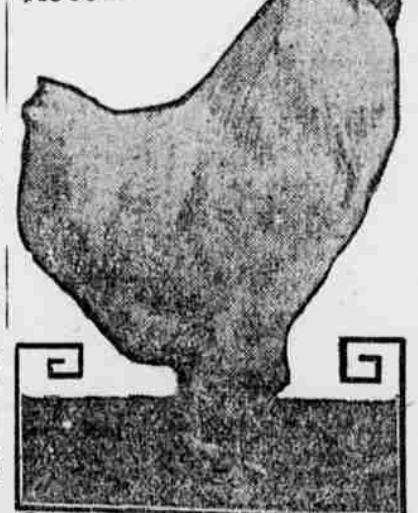
In all European countries veterinary science is receiving increased consideration. The increased value of live stock and the enlarged protection accorded the public health has broadened the sphere of veterinary science and it now ranks among the learned professions. Great Britain is awakening to the advantages of raising the standard of veterinary science. The imperial government has appropriated \$150,000 for the Dublin college and will supplement the grant by an additional \$46,500. The government is spending annually on the London Veterinary College \$30,000 and a strong effort is being made to advance the standard of veterinary education in England.

In nearly every commonwealth there is a veterinary state department to inspect the live stock on the farms and when it discovers animals suffering from contagious diseases it orders them destroyed to prevent the spread of contagion. The great distributing centers of live stock are encouraging higher veterinary education.

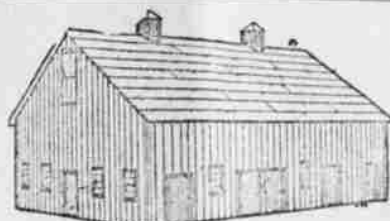

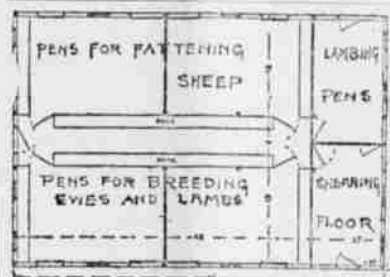
Barn for Sheep.

When in pasture sheep will always sleep on the highest and driest parts of the field. This should be kept in

mind in selecting the site for a sheep shed. Warm, close sheds are likely to be injurious to the health of the sheep, as the temperature of their blood is high and the fleece keeps in the body heat. Crowding is to be avoided especially at the feeding rack. The accompanying plan which is from the booklet, "Practical Farm Buildings" by F. W. Bird & Son, Hamilton, Ont., shows a building 40 feet wide and 60 feet long. It is in two stories, the first being 9 feet high and the second 6 feet from the floor to the eaves.

The sills are 6 in. by 8 in. resting preferably on stone foundation, and if set on posts they should be heavier. Doors are all 4 ft. wide and those that are used by the sheep should be sliding. Windows are 3 ft. wide and 4 1/2 ft. high. In the center of the sheep apartment there are double doors 10 ft. wide. When both are opened and the center post removed a wagon can be driven through to remove manure. The feed racks are all permanent as there is no necessity for their removal and they form a wall for the passage way which runs through the center. The loft will give storage space sufficient for fodder for the sheep.

Farmer of Future.

The future farmer will subdivide his land, and defy drought as well as floods. He will become a scientific forester, and every farm will produce wood and lumber as well as wheat and apples. A single acre will produce what ten acres yield now. Women will work out doors as heartily as men; in fact, they will be the horticulturists and the truck gardeners. There will be closer relation between the producer and consumer, ignoring a horde of middlemen who frequently waste more than is destroyed by ignorant help and insect foes combined. Under the alliance with the school the farm will be valued not only for its gross weight of products, but for its poems and its education. As our schools become places for applying as well as acquiring knowledge, our farm homes will become integral parts of the garden school and the school farm. The alliance between the home and the school will become very close. A valley full of farms is already the nearest to paradise that we have, but the future will tenfold its wealth and hundredfold its delights.

Cure for Anthrax.

Anthrax among horses in Arkansas, of which there has been several outbreaks in the last two years, is predominantly an inoculation disease spread by the sting of the horsefly. In treating the disease the Arkansas station found that anthrax vaccination was unsuccessful as a means for its prevention. Isolation and quarantine, disinfection and cremation of carcasses are the measures chiefly insisted upon by the station, but vaccination is recommended as a secondary measure when done under official supervision.

Unclean Dairy Must Go.

The old-fashioned unclean dairy must go. It cannot compete with the modern dairy. The time is coming, and soon, too, when milk from a dirty dairy cannot be sold. Most of the big milk and creamery companies now make provision in their farmer contracts for uniform feeding and clean dairy and the local newspaper reporters keep pretty close tab on the dairy farms and the milk companies and the demand for pure milk is becoming more emphatic all the time.
