William Rex Reece was born in Princeville, Illinois, February 7, 1875, and died at Chitwood, Oregon, February 13, 1909. He was therefore 34 years and six days old.

He had been sick for three weeks in which he suffered severely. Heart trouble was the cause of death.

William Reece was the only son of Samuel and Harriette Reece who lived at Princeville, Illinois, where William was born and brought up. He lived with his parents until their death, and spent the most of his life in Illinois. In 1897 he went to Spokane, Washington, with his brother John Adams, where he lived until three years ago when he came to Chitwood.

William Reece was converted when a boy of twelve and joined the M. E. church. He leaves two half brothers, Jonas F. Adams of Princeville, Ill., and John Q. Adams of this place, who will greatly miss him.
