Waldport Items.

Clifford Crosno, of Toledo came down on the Condor last week.

Miss Effie Williamson, primary teacher of the Waldport school has been on the sick list.

J. P. Wolfe brought a load of potatoes to town Wednesday and disposed of the lot at two cents per pound.

Capt. Tyler has kept the Condor moving the last week. Several trips were made between the two bays.

J. W. Wintermute, a plumber of Arleta, Oregon, has gone into camp in the Ruble field and will remain till fall.

The Waldport mill was operated full blast Sunday. There are too many orders on hand to close even one day in the week.

J. H. Glines left Sunday for Portland. He recently purchased a large quantity of water pipe in that city but now finds that between five and six hundred feet of his pipe was stolen after it had been delivered on the steamer dock at Portland. He will try to recover his property.

Bert Hays and T. T. Pankey came to town Saturday and purchased a large quantity of groceries, mill feed, etc. Also fifty pounds of giant powder and a large cream separator. On starting out on the return home it was found that their boat was loaded too heavily and as there was a considerable swell running at the time it was not long until the boat was swamped. Up to date everything has been recovered except the powder and a sack of salt.

Last week the C. J. Smith Realty Company surveyed out seventy-four lots for Mrs. Orlena Ruble. They are located on property known as the Ruble pasture and no doubt there will be a ready sale for the lots. There are only a few desirable building lots in the other additions to Waldport which remain unsold at this time and the demand this spring promises to exceed that of last year.

Rev. Rhys Gwynn returned on the 19th from attendance at the Valley Presbytery meeting at Eugene. Mr. Gwynn has been retained as pastor for the local church for another year. This action on the part of the Presbytery meets with the hearty approval of the Waldport people. Mr. J. H. Conrad, who also attended the meeting has not returned yet as he is visiting friends and relatives in the valley.

Waldport's water system is being installed as fast as possible. Over half the distance between the reservoir and town has been completed and the remainder will be finished in a few days. Owing to the demand for men in the mill it has been a hard proposition for Mr. Glines to get enough men to do the work as rapidly as desired. About thirty families have contracted for water up to this time.

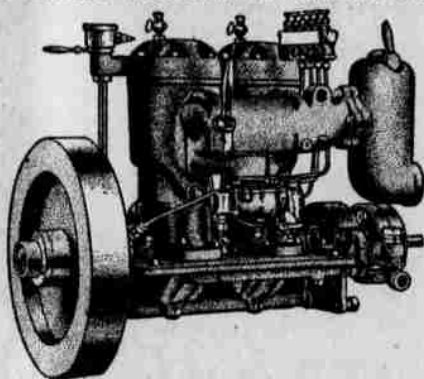
