PETITION FOR CREATION OF A DIKING DISTRICT.

In the County Court of the State of Oregon, for the county of Lincoln.

To the Honorable Court:

We the undersigned, your petitioners, allege and show to the Court: That the lands hereinafter described are tide and overflowed lands, subject to overflow by the tides at all seasons of the year, and by freshets and tides during the winter; that in their present condition they are not susceptible of cultivation to any appreciable extent, and can only be used in a limited way for pasture, during the times the tides are not over them; that by the reclamation of said lands, the taxable value thereof will be increased more than the cost of the reclamation, and that it will be for the general good, as well as greatly to the profit and advantage of the owners of said lands that they be reclaimed by diking; that we are the owners of more than one-half of the whole acreage of said lands, and more than one-half of the individual owners thereof; that we represent more than one-half of the area of the lands embraced therein; that it is desired to form a diking district for the purpose of improving by diking or damming the lands contained therein. Therefore, we respectfully petition the Honorable Court to create a diking district, as by Statute made and provided, embracing a portion of the following described lands, to-wit: The ne1/4 and ne1/4 of sw1/4 of sec. 26, the e1/2 of sw1/4 and e1/2 of sec. 23, and the nw1/4 and e1/2 of section 24, all in township 11 south, range 11 west of Willamette Meridian in Lincoln county, State of Oregon.

The dike and right of way therefor to run substantially as follows, to-wit: Beginning at stake marked X-1 at a point in the se1/4 of the ne1/4 of sec. 26 on the north bank of "Boones Slough" (or sometimes known as Mill 4 slough) about 10 rods west of the section line between sections 25 and 26, where the tideland joins the highland, running thence westerly and northwesterly along the north bank of said slough, through the e1/2 of the ne1/4 and the ne1/4 of sec. 26, thence through the ne corner of the ne1/4 of the sw1/4 of section 26 to the section line between sections 26 and 23; thence in a northerly and northeasterly direction along the east bank of said slough through the south half and sw1/4 of ne1/4 of section 23 to a stake marked X-2, set at point of hill where tideland joins the higher ground; thence in easterly direction to a stake marked X-3 placed at a point in the ne1/4 of section 23, where tide land joins the hill land; thence in easterly direction around the base of the hill and edge of tideland to a stake marked X-4, set on bank of slough designated in U. S. Govt. surveys as Chetco Slough, but now locally known as Derby's slough, in nw1/4 of sec. 24; thence in a southerly and easterly direction around the west and south bank of said slough to the mouth of "Pavey's Slough" in the se1/4 of the ne1/4 of section 24, thence in a northwesterly and westerly direction along the north bank of said Pavey's Slough to a stake marked X-5, set on the north bank of said slough in the ne1/4 of sw1/4 of section 24; thence in a southerly direction to a stake marked X-6, set at the edge of tideland and foot of the hill; thence in a westerly and southerly direction along edge of tideland and foot of hill through the sw1/4 of section 24, se1/4 of section 23, and ne1/4 of section 26, to place of beginning, the lands above described being in Township 11s, Range 11w of Willamette Meridian and in Lincoln county, Oregon, and we, your petitioners, will ever pray.

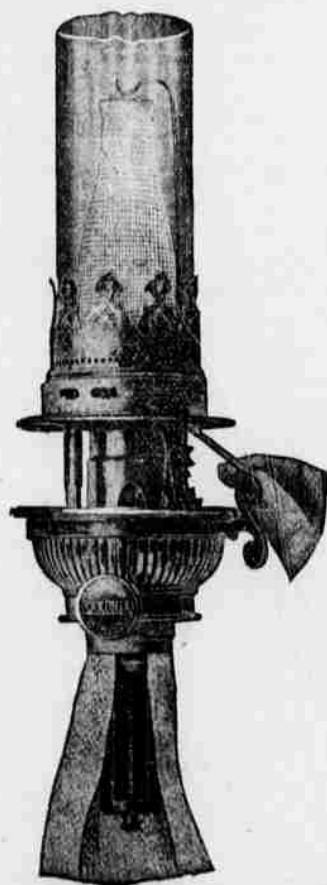
