Don't forget Waldport's celebration on July third.

August Fischer, of Corvallis, was in town last week.

Leslie Evens returned on the 17 from a trip to Newport.

O. V. Hurt moved to the Yachats last week and will reside on the Seigel place.

The Misses Dodge are visiting Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Thissell.

Last week's Commercial Club program was a hummer. They are getting better all the time.

The post office at Ocean View has been discontinued and Mrs. Hosford brought up the supplies last week and turned them over to the Waldport office.

Oliver Bennett returned last Saturday from the Valley. He tried to get telephone communication with Waldport but says the Sheriff was a little ahead of him and cut the wires.

An interesting institute was held at the local school house on the 19. A number of teachers from the different parts of the county were present and our beautiful school building came in for its share of praise.

The Waldport team met with another defeat Sunday when they fell before a team of Uncle Sam's soldiers who are camped at Seal Rocks. The score was eight to one but it was a good game and the local team is showing some improvement.

The appointment of O. V. Hurt to the position of Collector of Customs for the Port of Yaquina is eminently satisfactory to the residents of Waldport. Mr. Hurt is competent in every way to fill the office and his selection is but a recognition of past service to the Republican party.

Sheriff Ross appeared on the scene the morning of the 16th and soon had L. V. Colvin busy cutting the telephones off from the main line in Waldport. It is not known yet just who is at the bottom of the trouble but it is safe to say that those damaged by such an unnecessary act will do all they can to collect a reasonable damage.

School meeting went off quietly on the 21. W. H. Wann was chosen as director for the term of three years and J. H. Glines was elected clerk to serve one year. Reiring Clerk Conrad reported a balance in the bank of \$411.59. His report was approved and placed on file. By a vote it was decided to instruct the directors to expend the balance of the 1907 tax money in improvements on sidewalks and grounds. A resolution directing the Board to proceed against the property of those carrying on the liquor business in Waldport received but six negative votes, five of those being cast by women.

Graduation exercises were held in Evens' hall the evening of the 19th. There were four graduates from the eighth grade; James Goin, who read the class history; E. Lebow, who read the class prediction; Halcie Glines, who read the last will and testament of the class; and Irwin Hosford, who read a paper on Abraham Lincoln. Miss Ona Glines, who graduated from the ninth grade delivered an oration entitled "The True American." Miss Glines received many compliments on the composition and its delivery. C. R. Evens made a short address on the advancement of the district during the past twelve years. Several selections were played by the band.
