Sheriff Gellatly feels that the Benton County Court has not treated him fairly in turning down his bill for \$68 sent in for expense incurred in the attempt to recapture the Lincoln county man who escaped from the Benton county jail. While the bill perhaps rightly belongs to Lincoln county, Sheriff Gellatly thinks Benton county should pay his bill and then collect from Lincoln. While he admits that the Lincoln county man escaped only through his own leniency Sheriff Gellatly points to the fact that prisoners are constantly escaping from the state penitentiary, reform school and from the jails of different counties, and the expense of the recapture never falls upon the warden or sheriff. Had the Lincoln county man been in jail here serving a sentence, the sheriff says he would hardly have been so lenient with him. As it was, the man was here merely awaiting trial, and he had a long time to wait, so Sheriff Gellatly gave him air and exercise—a little to much. In the attempt to recapture him the Sheriff used the telephone freely and used the services of men across the mountains, so he sent in a bill to cover expense, cutting out his personal expenditures. He feels that he should not have to bear all the burden—but there are some who do not agree with him.—Times-Gazette.

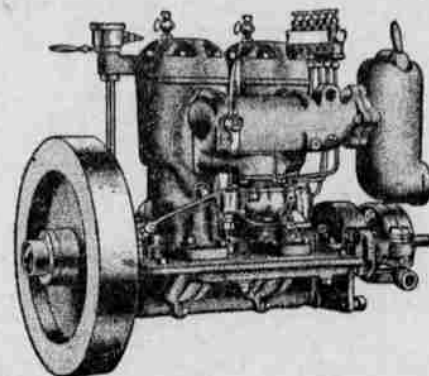
