Fulton 10; Lincoln County 7.

The above tells just how the big game of baseball here last Sunday ended. Fully 300 people witnessed the game, people from nearly every section of the county. The Fulton boys arrived down from Portland some Saturday noon others on the Sunday excursion.

The game was called about 2:30 o'clock and a light mist was falling, just enough to make the grass wet which kept the balls nice and slippery during the game, which was undoubtedly the cause of the high score made.

The first inning resulted in a bunch of 4 runs for Fulton and a nice big goose egg for the locals. In the second Fulton made 2 and the locals 4, the third brought 2 more to the visitors, which closed the scoring until the seventh, when Fultons scored 1 more. The home boys by some fancy playing scored three runs in the 8th, making 10 for Fulton and 7 for the locals.

Lincoln County lost the game in the first two innings by some very bad plays. The short stop, by playing out of his territory spoiled two very close plays by butting into other players, in each instance allowing Fultons to score. Smith of Newport, made the big catch of the game when he picked up a long fly to left field. Casey of Siletz set the crowd wild when he made a clean steal from 1st to home plate. Smith came in the game in the 2nd inning, relieving J. S. Akin, Casey held the pitchers' box until the 6th when Simpson took the box, Casey going to 2nd base; Cook relieved Dr. Burgess at 1st, Akin went to left, Hughes to center, Smith to short stop.

Considering the team was composed of players who had never before played together and that most of them were playing out of their usual positions, the local boys put an excellent game. The Fulton team is a good one and displayed excellent team work.

Commissioners' Court.

An adjourned term of Commissioners' Court was held last Saturday. The matter of the special tax levied in 1905, in road district No. 8, amounting to \$526.69, was taken up. The money was diverted to a fund for a purpose of opening up and grading the Olalla road, beginning at the east end of 7th street in Toledo and continuing up the Olalla valley toward Siletz. A meeting of the legal voters was held on the 23d at which time a resolution was passed asking the court to make the order.

The matter of the proposed dyking district petitioned for by M. M. Davis, et al, was continued until the next regular term of Court, for more complete report of the viewers of said district.

I. J. Pepin was authorized to repair the bridge across the river at Eddyville, at a cost of \$50.

Resignation of F. B. Davis as viewer of dyking district accepted.

Sheriff authorized, as tax collector, to proceed as by law required to sell all property sold to Lincoln county for delinquent taxes upon which the time for redemption has expired. The Sheriff's notice appears in this issue.

Town plat of Waldport Heights was approved.

Several bills against the proposed dyking district were continued.

D. F. Scott was allowed \$95.70 for building bridge at West Yaquina; F. A. Stoner's bill for \$267.30 as supervisor of district 12, was allowed; Fir and Spruce Lumber Co's bill of \$13.42 was allowed, and B. W. Hayes, supervisor of district 1, for \$138.25 was allowed.
