**ROCK ROADS FOR LINCOLN COUNTY**

**The County Court Embarks Upon a Crushed Rock System for Roads**

The County Court, at an adjourned meeting last week definitely decided to begin the system of building permanent roads in this county out of crushed rock, after a careful investigation of the merits and demerits of all the available materials for road building in this county. To this end the Court has ordered and purchased a rock crusher, and as soon as it arrives it will begin the work of crushing rock and placing the same on the roads.

We are informed that the crusher, for the present, will be placed along side the railroad track in the north part of town, where the rock can be easily unloaded from the cars directly to the crusher. Steam power will be used to crush the stone. The present intention is to bring the rock from a short distance above Pioneer, where an excellent quality of rock for road purposes has been found. It will be shipped by rail to the crusher at this place, the railroad company having made an extremely low rate for the shipment, in order to encourage the county to use rock on the roads.

The advertisement for bids for the placing of the first two miles of this road appears in this issue. The Court has used good judgment in determining to use rock on the roads, and the people and taxpayers of the county are to be congratulated upon the determination of the court to make the best roads to be had. With good, permanent roads our county will progress as never before.

**Report of Grand Jury.**

To the Honorable J. W. Hamilton, Judge of the above entitled Court: The undersigned, constituting the Grand Jury of the above entitled court, at the August, 1909 term thereof, respectfully make this their final report as follows: We have examined into all crimes committed and triable in said Lincoln County, Oregon, which have come to our knowledge or attention and make report thereof, except that certain matters are now pending upon which we cannot make report at this time, and we have therefore adjourned to meet on Friday, February 11th, 1910, at the hour of nine o'clock in the morning of said day.

We have examined the several county offices and the condition thereof, and beg to report that we find the offices in good condition and the books and files thereof neatly kept. We would recommend that the vault in the clerk's office be enlarged by extending the same at least ten feet into the office; and that the vault be furnished with steel furnishings.

We find that the county has no jail, and we earnestly recommend the propriety and necessity of the erection at an early date of a jail of sufficient capacity for this county.

It is not consistent with the dignity or obligations of the county to try to exist without a jail to hold its prisoners.

We would further recommend that the water closet now in use in connection with the courthouse be abandoned, and that modern and sanitary closets be installed; and further that an arrangement be made by which water be brought to the courthouse grounds for protection.
