The Corvallis & Eastern railroad company has been granted a restraining order enjoining the state land board from selling the tide-lands in this county, granted to the railroad company in 1874. Last year the land board took the position that this land belongs to the state because the terms of the act granting the land to the company had not been carried out. Recently the state land board advertised for sale, in the LEADER, some of this and the sale was to have been made last Tuesday, but attorneys for the railroad petitioned for and secured the restraining order. It is expected that this will be a long and hard fought case.
