Lots are cheap and rent is a fair price, and a dozen or more houses would be filled all the time. Some of you moneyed men look into the matter.

The graders on the Toledo-Siletz wagon road finished the grading from town to the Enos place last Saturday, and have moved to Siletz to begin grading. This road is on a fine grade and when the crushed rock is put on will be as good a piece of road as anywhere in the state. The machinery for laying the crushed rock will soon be here, when work will begin. Surely we are going to have modern roads.

Waldport is to be congratulated on having secured the creamery at that place. It means several hundreds of dollars will be distributed among the farmers of that vicinity. Not only will that immediate vicinity be benefitted but every man, woman and child in the county will be benefitted to an extent. There should be a dozen creameries and cheese factories in Lincoln county. We have the pasture and feed for ten thousand more dairy cattle. This county could be made one of the best dairy counties on the Pacific coast, or the world.

The Electric Light Company have received their new generator. It is a 60 kilowatt, 2300 volt machine, capable of furnishing current for 1400-16 C. P. lamps, sufficient capacity to light a town twice the size of Toledo. Their engine and other supplies will soon arrive and will be installed as soon as the wiring of buildings is completed. They evidently has faith in the future of Toledo, and our people are showing their faith in the company by preparing for a liberal amount of lights.
