We have been having some of the weather this week that made Lincoln county famous. It can't be beat.

When you see a banana peel resting on the sidewalk and a fat man unconsciously approaching it, the indications point to an early fall.

The rock crusher for use of the county in making roads arrived in Toledo Tuesday evening. This machine has a capacity of 10 tons per hour. As soon as the sidetrack is laid the machine will be set up and put in operation. The engines and other road making machinery will follow soon.

The Modern Improvement Company is building a large 20x70 for their piledriver and derrick. The barge is being built at the Toledo shipyard and will be ready to launch in a couple of weeks. As soon as completed it will be taken to Newport, where the company has a contract for the government driving piling for the life saving station. They have several jobs ahead and the construction work is being rushed as fast as possible.

The Toledo Light, Power and Manufacturing Company has concluded to build their plant nearer town than was at first intended. They have graded and the lumber is on the ground and they will build on the southeast corner of J. F. Stewart's property adjoining town. The building will be 24x24, one story, with a lean-to for boiler room. The dynamo is here and the boiler and engine will be here by the time the building is completed. An eighty horsepower boiler will be installed. These people are putting in a plant capable of supplying a town twice the size of Toledo, but they have hopes of the growth of the town and do not intend tearing out this machinery in a year or two to be replaced by a larger plant.
