In Memoriam.

When she was yet a small child her parents removed to Toledo and made their home. Here with her parents she grew into womanhood, and in February, 1895, she was united in marriage to Frank D. Tiltonson. With her husband she made her home here until 1900, when they removed to Wasco County, Oregon, near Wamic, at which place she resided with her family till the time of her death, which occurred on September 30, 1909. Her death was sudden, her illness being only a few days duration. Her death leaves a bereaved husband, and three motherless children, two daughters and a son, to mourn for a loss that cannot be filled.

The deceased who lived the greater part of her life in Toledo, was known to most of the people here, and was universally beloved by all who had the privilege of her acquaintance. From a bright modest girl, she grew into womanhood, and became a loving wife and mother. To her husband she was the most devoted wife, and to her children she was all that is embodied in that most sacred name of mother. Meeting both joys and the trials of life with a serene and earnest desire to do her duty fully, she shed the radiant gleam of womanhood upon the wide circle of her life. At the time of her death she was a member of Syringa Circle of the Women of Woodcraft, of Toledo, which membership she had held for a long period of years, and her death is deeply mourned by that order.

Mr. and Mrs. Lee Wade went to Albany Saturday morning.

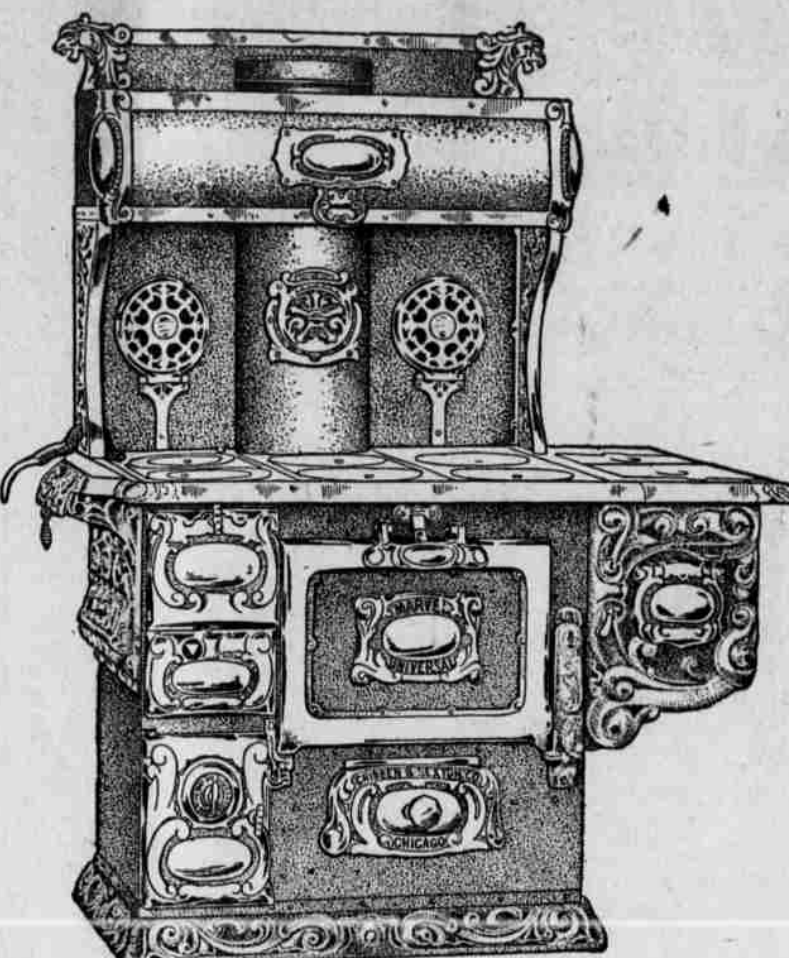
J. E. Wilson of Chitwood was a county seat visitor last Friday, having dental work done by Mrs. Dr. Adams.
