The crew repairing the mill and adjusting the machinery are making things lively.

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received by the County Court of Lincoln County for the construction of roads in Road District No. 18, as per specifications contained in Resolution passed by voters in said Road District and on file in the County Clerk's office. The following specifications for work, to be completed by August 1, 1910.

Beginning at the east end of dike on land of J. Shinar, at mouth of J. Sijota slough, and completed to Petros camp on Siletz River, on light of way of wagon road as surveyed and accepted, to be slashed, graded, drained and bridged, a roadway 16 ft wide and slashed 12 ft each side of roadway, bridges to be 12 ft wide. Bids may be made for East and West half of road, by designating the starting and finishing points.

Bids are also asked for the completion of dike Also for work on Canoe Landing and Hoopa Road, to begin at the end of work which is near the three mile stake and completed to the end of survey, a distance of about 4 1/2 miles. From the three mile stake to the five mile stake to be as follows: Slashed, grubbed and bridged, the roadway to be grubbed ten width of sixteen feet and slashed twelve feet on each side of roadway, grading only in low or wet places and at each end of bridges. From the five mile stake the improvements will be on the new survey to the township line between township 8 south and township 9 south, range 10 west, the work to be as follows: Graded 12 feet wide and slashed 20 feet on the upper side of roadway the bridges to be 12 feet wide. Each mile of work may be bid on separately. All bids to be presented on or before February 10, 1910.
