

the kitchens of the country is responsible for many cases of cancer, was the striking theory advanced by Dr. William H. Dieffanbach, of New York, in a paper entitled, "Observations on the Etiology of Cancer," réad before the Bureau of, Sanitary Science and Public Health, at which leading experts of the International Homoeopathic Congress met today to discuss questions of public health. The argument advanced was that clipping of the hard-coated dishes used in preparation of meals allowed minute but dangerous particles of foreign matter to become mixed with the food. These are taken into the stomach, where the cancerous growth is caused by abrasions which they make in the walls of the organ.
