Ordinance, No. 80

An Ordinance to declare a certain piece of land, deeded to the City of Toledo, Oregon, by A. D. Perkins on March 19 1909, and Recorded in Book No. 19 Records of Deeds in Lincoln County, Oregon, on page 183, a public street and order the same opened to the public and to name said Street.

Whereas; on the 19th day of March 1909, A. D. Perkins did by Deed convey to the City of Toledo, Oregon, the following described Real Estate to wit: Beginning at a point 10 feet west of the South West corner of Block No 9 in Vincents Addition to the City of Toledo Lincoln County Oregon, and run thence South Four Hundred and forty feet, thence West forty five feet, thence North four hundred and forty feet, thence East forty five feet to place of beginning, as surveyed by Z. M. Derrick, County Surveyor on January 1st, 1909. All situated in Section 17 T, 11 S, R, 10 W, for the use of the public as a public highway only.

Therefore, be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Toledo Oregon.

Sec 1— The within described Real Estate is hereby declared by the Common Council of the City of Toledo, Oregon, to be and shall constitute a Public Street, as provided in the City Charter of the City of Toledo Oregon, in Section 25 on page 480.

Sec 2— Said above described Street shall be known as a continuation of "C" Street, and shall be opened to the public within 40 days after the approval of this Ordinance by the Mayor.
