A Letter

To the readers of the Lincoln Co. LEADER—Thinking that perhaps some of the good people of Lincoln Co. Oregon would like to know how we are getting along, I write and say right here we are all O. K. When I last wrote I was working in the packing house in Fresno. When the boy and I worked over hours we made our \$4.50 per day. From 7 a. m. till 6 p. m. loaded teams took their turns to be unloaded some wagons with four tons on. Mostly raisins, some peaches and other fruit.

Fresno is a nice clean town the county seat of Fresno Co. and the geographical center of Cal. There is a nice park in the center of the town where the Court House stands. Another near the S. P. depot, and two out of town. The town is surrounded by a rich country, land is high and on the advance. We bought 2 1/2 acres about 1/4 mile outside the city limits, paid \$1250, build a house, bored a well, set out strawberries and other berries and settled down to business.

There were two things we did not like, summer heat and winter fogs, we were told the thermometer registers as high as 118 in summer, this winter it ran down to 25 above zero. You may think it strange in the center of Cal. that women wear furs and muffs and the men mits and overcoats, but it is so just the same. One day I saw a man with a buffalo robe over coat on and he looked happy. The fogs are very cold, some winters the sun is hid from view by the fog for three to six weeks at a time.

A Dentist in the city wanted our place for a country home so we sold and hiked south, we spent a few days in Los Angeles visiting friends and taking in the sights. The resident part of the city is very nice. We visited the Cawston Ostrich farm near south Pasadena Cal. One male bird lately imported from Africa stands 8 ft. high. The males are black, the females gray, both having some white plumage. They lay a large egg weighing about three lbs. and newly hatched frowsty chicks are about the size of a large hen and when six months old are full grown. At nine months they begin plucking the beautiful plumage. At the age of four years the male birds choose their mate for life. The average life of the ostrich is from 40 to 50 years though many have been known to reach the age of 100 yrs. The male feathered giant is a vicious fighter, and it is almost impossible to separate two of these gallants when once they are dueling. The diet consists of alfalfa, grain, vegetables, oranges and any other valuables he may be able to pinch from the apron of amazed tourists. The stride of an ostrich when in a hurry, is 22 ft.

We now find ourselves in San Pasqual Valley in San Diego Co. Cal. I doubt if a more fertile, cozy nook can be found any where surrounded as it is with the hills and a small river flowing through its center. Here we find today beans in bloom, oranges and lemon trees loaded with ripe fruit and blossoms, peaches, apricots, and almonds as large as marbles, alfalfa almost ready to cut, truly this is a lovely place, sun shines nearly every day. I have hired to a seventh day Adventist vegetable gardener who raises early vegetables to ship North. I get \$1.50 a day and my dinner, a house to live in plenty of wood, vegetables, oranges, lemons, and olives free.

Roy is working in a Vegetarian Cafeteria at Los Angeles for \$7.00 a week and his board. He is well and enjoys his work. My health is good and my wife's health is improving. So you see we are all O. K.
