Sec 1—Hill Street shall be permanently
improved by grading the same to con-
form to the grade as now established,
and of record in the office of the City
Recorder from the north line of the in-
tersection of Hill and Seventh Streets,
to the north line of the intersection of
Hill and Ninth Streets.

Sec 2—Said Grade and improve-
ment shall be completed within 60 days
from and after the approval of this
ordinance.

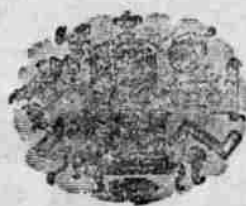

An Ordinance to declare a certain
piece of land, deeded to the City of To-
ledo, Oregon, by A. D. Perkins on
March 19 1909, and Recorded in Book

to the City of Toledo, Oregon, the fol-
