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The Fair Committee

President J. F. Stewart of the Toledo Development League has appointed the Executive Committee for the coming county fair. The committee is composed of the following well known enterprising citizens: Wallis Nash of Nashville; A. L. McDonald, Chitwood; Carl Davis, Siletz; B. F. Grant, Harlan; C. H. Bradshaw, Newport; O. Middlekauff, Yaquina; W. F. Keady Waldport; Silas Howell, Yachats and Five Rivers; A. J. Oglesby, Tidewater; J. Veit, Eddyville; O. G. Dalaba, Elk City; J. W. Bones, Lower Siletz, and E. J. Avery Toledo. Beaver Creek's representative had not been appointed up to date. Every man on this committee is a representative man in his district and the county, and there is no question but that they will lend every effort to the making of the best fair ever held in the county. Every citizen in the county is expected to co-operate with the members of this committee and give them every possible assistance. All get together for a greater fair.

Rock Crusher to Start.

The rock crusher has been installed, the building for storing the machinery, and the bins for the crushed rock have been built, the side track to the crusher laid, and the engines—a traction engine to be used for running the crusher and hauling on the road, and a heavy steam roller—arrived Wednesday evening. The work at the quarry at Pioneer is being rushed rapidly, and the work of crushing and placing the rock on the Toledo-Depot Slough-Siletz wagon road will be begun at once.

Our County Judge and Commissioners have been doing everything within their power to put in the machinery necessary and have this work done in a manner satisfactory to all concerned, and the people are appreciating their efforts. When this road is completed it will be one of the very best roads found in any county in the state.

When this modern road is completed other roads will be built and ere many years roll-around Lincoln county will be noted for her good roads which is one of the essentials in any country. Good roads are the best drawing card a community can have, and while they are necessarily expensive, they are a paying investment.

Our commissioners are not contented with laboring for this one good road but they are rushing road work all over the county. They are having the roads leveled, holes filled, ditches dug, etc. A crew of workmen has been working on the old Siletz road putting it in first class repair for the Summer travel. They will probably begin the repair work in the Toledo-Newport road right away. This will assist the travel between Lincoln county's two principal cities.

The people of Toledo and Siletz road districts owe much to the County Court, and especially to Commissioner Kentta, who has not taken his coat off since the new Siletz road was first started and has devoted almost his entire time in arranging for the building of this road.
