Crosno, Toledo, Oregon: My bill as amended by the committee, providing that patents be issued to the settlers on the former Siletz Indian Reservation, passed the Senate today. W. C. Hawley."

A Word to the Patrons of School Districts.

The annual school meeting is almost here and there are many who are at a loss as to what to do regarding the tax that they must levy. I will suggest that you vote no tax at all until after the board of equalization meets, which will be the latter part of October. In other words, do not vote a tax until you get a statement of the valuation of your district from the County Clerk. He can give them out after the first of November. There has been many changes in the past year. The valuation of some districts has been more than doubled, while in a few instances it has been cut down. The following shows some of the changes in the valuation:

A change in the boundary makes some of the difference, but in some of these districts the boundaries were not changed.

To those who are wanting to know the valuation of their districts, I will say that it will be impossible to tell before the latter part of October or the first of November.

If the notice of your special levy is in the hands of the County Clerk by the 10th day of December, 1910, that will be in plenty of time.

Should you vote a tax at the annual school meeting you may do as some of the other districts did last year, get more money than you need.
