Next to a man's family, his personal friends and his business, nothing should arouse his energies in its behalf more thoroughly than the town in which he lives, remarks the Astoria Star. It is his home. It is the place in which he earns his competence and educates his children. If he wants to make it as popular, as thrifty and as widely known as possible, he cannot afford to be indifferent to anything which will further those ends. It can be said a town that is not worthy of the devotion of its citizens in making it widely and generally prosperous is a town in which it is not worth while to live at all. If a town is worth anything it is worthy of our greatest energy, whether we receive an immediate dividend in dollars and cents or whether we merely take our share of the common benefits according to the town and community we call home. Patronize those who patronize you. Spend your money among home institutions where you stand a good chance to get it back. Every dollar you spend with a home man finds its way back to your pocket. Figure it down fine and you lose money by buying away from home, even if you do get the article for less than what it cost you at home.

We wish to call attention to the law relative to the setting of camp and other fires, the burning of brush, slashings, etc. There has been no time in years when conditions were so favorable to forest fires as at present and people should be very careful in this matter, not only observe the law but for their own protection. Some of the larger timber men are hiring men to patrol their land and they will be clothed with proper authority to report and prosecute any persons violating the law. Forest fires are raging in many parts of the northwest, destroying millions of dollars worth of timber and unless strict vigilance is kept we may have fires in the forests of this county, which would be disastrous. Observe the law and see that others obey it.

The Western Forestry and Conservation Association, which embraces the states of Oregon, California, Washington, Montana and Idaho, is carrying on a campaign to save the forests from the usual fire losses that occur each summer. This organization represents thirteen minor associations. Printed matter, fire warnings and circulars, are being sent out to timber owners, millmen, farmers and others interested or directly concerned. In its
