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Forest Fires.

Forest fires are raging in many sections of the state and are destroying thousands of acres of valuable timber, which means a dead loss to the communities in which the fires are burning, and to every citizen of the state. At Hoover, on the east end of the C. & E. railroad, fire the first of the week completely destroyed the town, rendering many families homeless. This is one of the driest seasons for years and a little fire started in the timber of this county might destroy millions of dollars' worth of property and many lives, and ruin the county, as the timber is one of the chief resources of the county. As a precaution to prevent the setting of fires our County Court is making every effort to patrol the forests and educate our people regarding the law, which is being reproduced in this issue. We hope every person in the county will read and be governed thereby. Be careful of starting fires and see that everyone else obeys the law.

J. G. Plank and crew of workmen are busily engaged in erecting the Fair buildings. The old stock sheds used last year on the ground of the Fir and Spruce company have been taken down and moved to the permanent fair grounds. The work of constructing the new buildings will be rushed as rapidly as possible, and long before they will be needed they will be completed. The main exhibit building will be 40x100 feet and there will be ample shed room to accommodate all the stock that will be exhibited. The buildings will all be put up substantially and there will be no danger of damage to exhibits by reason of rain or wind, should there be any. The grounds will be well lighted with electricity and water piped to the ground and everything will be done to make the visitors comfortable. This is going to be the greatest fair ever held in this county, and is going to be a great advertisement.
