FIRE WARNING

For protection of forests of the State of Oregon, the following regulations governing setting out of fires are provided in an Act of the Legislature of 1907:

Control of Fires

That any person who wilfully or negligently allows fire to escape from his own lands shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or imprisonment for not less than one month nor more than one year.

Camp Fires

Any person who leaves a camp fire burning or permits a fire to spread upon lands within this State not his own shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25) nor more than five hundred dollars.

Firearms

Any person who uses in any firearms discharged upon lands not his own other than incombustible gun wadding, shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars [\$25] nor more than five hundred dollars [\$500].

Forbidden to Set Out Fires

Any person who shall unlawfully or maliciously set fire to any woods, forest, timber, brush, or any vegetable matter whatever with the intent that the property of another shall be injured thereby, shall be guilty of a felony, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment in the state penitentiary for not less than one nor more than ten years.

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
