The Clam Bake a Success.

The clam bake given at Newport last Sunday was more of a success than any previous occasion of the kind. Fully twelve hundred people were in the city for the day. These together with the regular Summer visitors, who number into the thousands, filled the town to overflowing. The day was most beautiful, very warm and with out wind. It is estimated that fully 4000 people were fed at the bake. The management of the bake is to be congratulated on the manner in which they accommodated the vast crowd. The clams, crabs, fish, potatoes, etc., which were all cooked together in the same pit, were delicious, and the manner of serving the food to the people was of the best.

The steamer Truant took about 140 people from Toledo, and many launches were pressed into service. It is estimated that 250 Toledo visitors attended. The railroad excursion took down over 1000 from the Valley and points along the road. The train consisted of seventeen cars, run in two sections with two engines to each section to pull them over the mountains.

It was a big event and one that the citizens of Newport should have at least once a year.
