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Despite the warning of our County Court, who have done everything to warn and acquaint the people of this county of the danger of fires during this dry season, fires are raging in almost every direction. While none of them appear serious at present, as the big timber seems in no immediate danger, yet one of these little fires may suddenly spread into the timber and destroy millions of dollars worth of timber. In every section of the northwest forest fires are burning, wiping out cities and killing many people, and the same thing might happen in this county. The county has several fire wardens patrolling the timber of the county watching and fighting fires, but they could not handle a big fire, should one start. It is up to the citizens of the county to keep a close watch for fires that have been started and see that no more are started. At this time the atmosphere is so thick with smoke that the sun is obscured. On the road between here and Siletz a fire has been raging for several days, but by untiring efforts of a large crew of men under the direction of W. C. Fischer the fire is now under control. On Depot slough a few miles above Toledo a fire is reported to be burning. For three days the Stewart hill just out of town has been ablaze and for some time has threatened the destruction of several homes. South of Aintree's mill another fire is burning. While there is no immediate danger of any of these fires spreading into the big woods they are destroying much small timber and wood and are a menace to the residence in the vicinity.

U. S. Grant of Dallas has shipped eight angora goats to a Virginia breeder, all being exceptionally choice stock. Northwest breeders are reaching out for the best livestock markets.

Passenger agents of all railways terminating at Portland announce that an immigration of at least 100,000 people is expected in the Northwest this fall, in the excursion period between September 15 and October 15. About 85,000 are estimated to have come last Spring.

People cannot be too careful with fire at this season of the year. A campfire left smoldering is apt to be fanned into flame, by a passing breeze, and create a destructive fire causing loss of life and property. Cigarettes, cigars and burnt matches should be thoroughly extinguished before being tossed aside. If people would observe these little things more carefully there would be fewer forest fires to contend with.
