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Our Candidates.

There are some who have not had the pleasure of a personal acquaintance with all the men nominated at the last primary election, who will seek Republican support for the election to the various county offices, so we will give a short sketch of each candidate:

Chas. H. Gardner, candidate for re-election for County Judge, has been a resident of Lincoln County for about seven years, and for about four years was a hardware merchant at Toledo. While Mr. Gardner has had but little experience in probate and county matters in Oregon, he has had education on these lines that is now valuable to him. He was deputy and County Clerk of Lee county, Illinois, for about twelve years, and as such had charge of all probate, revenue and board of supervisors' records. Mr. Gardner is a Republican and no one has ever questioned his integrity.

Bert Geer, candidate for Sheriff, is a native Oregonian, and a member of one of the oldest families in Oregon, and a resident of Elk City. Mr. Geer is a young man who has the respect and confidence of all who know him. Worthy and well qualified for the position he aspires to be elected.

M. Wygant, C. E., candidate for County Surveyor, is a native of New York. He came to Oregon in 1891, settled near Albany and came to this county in 1901. He was county surveyor of this county for one term. He has had 28 years' experience as surveyor in Oregon and Iowa; does railroad work, topographical and land surveying. He is now city engineer of Newport. Mr. Wygant is thoroughly competent and worthy of the support of every voter at the November election.

George B. McCluskey, candidate for re-election to the office of County Treasurer, was born near Toledo 31 years ago. He attended Toledo's public schools, and graduated at Philomath college in 1900. He taught in public and high schools of Oregon for six years. Was admitted to practice law in 1909, and at present is engaged in the practice of this profession here. Mr. McCluskey was appointed to the office of County Treasurer, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of J. L. Hyde, in September, 1907, and was re-elected without opposition in June, 1908. His education and familiarity with the work thoroughly equips him for the duties of his office.

Fred W. Chambers, candidate for Joint Representative of Lincoln and Polk Counties, was born in Kings Valley in 1873, and came to Toledo in 1882, and since resided continuously here. He is a full-fledged Republican. He is a heavy property owner in the county. He will use his best efforts to bring about needed legislative reforms in the two counties he seeks to represent.

Henry Howell, candidate for County Clerk, is a young man, a native of Benton and Lincoln counties. He received his education at the Oregon Agricultural College at Corvallis. For many years he has resided at Waldport. He was Assessor of this county one term, and we

all know he is competent for the position of County Clerk.

Dr. F. M. Carter, the candidate for re-election for the office of Coroner, has held that office in this county for the past several terms, and held it satisfactorily. Vote for him and thus keep the office in the hands of a competent officer.

Tillamook and Bay City have taken effective steps to secure the improvement of their harbors. The port commissions of these two cities will co-operate with the national government in the work and will add to the fund provided for the purpose in the rivers and harbors appropriation. It is estimated that the work of improvement will cost about \$2,000,000. Tillamook and Bay City have pledged \$650,000 of this amount. The preliminary examination of the Tillamook waterways has just been made by Jay J. Morrow, the government engineer in charge of this district, and work on the improvement will be begun as soon as feasible.

Oregon leads the whole country in apple production this season, according to the latest report of the Department of Agriculture, which deals with orchard conditions up to September 1. The condition of the state's apple crop at that time was given as 93 per cent of a full crop, while its nearest competitor could show but 90 per cent. The condition of the crop throughout the whole country was given as 45.8 per cent of a full crop. The Northwest states make the best showing of all.

The Forest Service plans the seeding of between 5000 and 6000 acres of burned-over lands at a cost of approximately \$20,000. About 700 acres, situated at the Bull Run watershed, the source of Portland's water supply, will be reforested in this way. The largest amount of planting will be done in the Mt. Hebo district south of Tillamook, which was burned over in 1847 and never reforested. On most of this area Eastern hardwoods will be planted.

A remarkable telescope that enables men stationed at Fort Stevens to detect the approach of an enemy while they are still more than 22 miles off shore has just been installed there. By its aid the range of the approaching fleet can be obtained and the mechanism is so adjusted that it overcomes the effects of the curvature of the earth on an ordinary telescope.
