October 1, Five Rivers Grange, with 42 charter members. Master, Bert L. Snell; lecturer, Mary J. Earnest; secretary, Anna Larsen.

October 8, Mountain Dell Grange, Lobster creek, with 23 members. Master, George Mason; lecturer, Ernest Sapp; secretary, Lillian Mason.

October 15, Waldport Grange, with 26 members. Master, Ernest E. Everson; lecturer, Effie Williamson; secretary, Donald Brooks. Total new members, 121.

Lincoln Grange at Ona, organized over a year ago, is prospering. A two-story building, 24x40 feet, for a grange hall is so far completed that a reception and supper was given last Saturday night. Receipts netted over \$21. The hall will hardly be dedicated before next Spring.

Deputy Walker arrived in Toledo yesterday morning and is canvassing for charter members, hoping to organize a Grange here tomorrow afternoon at one o'clock. They will meet in the City Hall.

Non-partisan Candidate for Circuit Judge, to Reside in Coos County.

To the Voters of Douglas, Lane, Benton and Lincoln Counties:

At an earlier period in the present campaign, many citizens of Coos County expressed a desire that I should become a candidate for the office of Circuit Judge. I deferred conclusion of the matter until a week ago, when I expressed a willingness to offer myself as a non-partisan candidate; dependent, however, upon an endorsement of such strength and character as would afford assurance to the voters of the other counties comprising this Judicial District, to whom I may be little known, that there is substantial local desire for my election. Within four days from the day of my declaration over seven hundred electors of all political faiths had signed my certificate of nomination.

With this endorsement, I submit my candidacy to the voters of Douglas, Lane, Benton and Lincoln counties.

Assuming, as I think I may do that the interest of these voters in the selection of a Judge to reside in Coos County is largely incidental, and that, in the absence of personal knowledge of candidates, only political affiliations would serve a majority of them as a guide to their choice for such official, I am hopeful that they may be pleased to give favorable consideration to the non-partisan choice of myself by the people of this, the most concerned section of the district.
